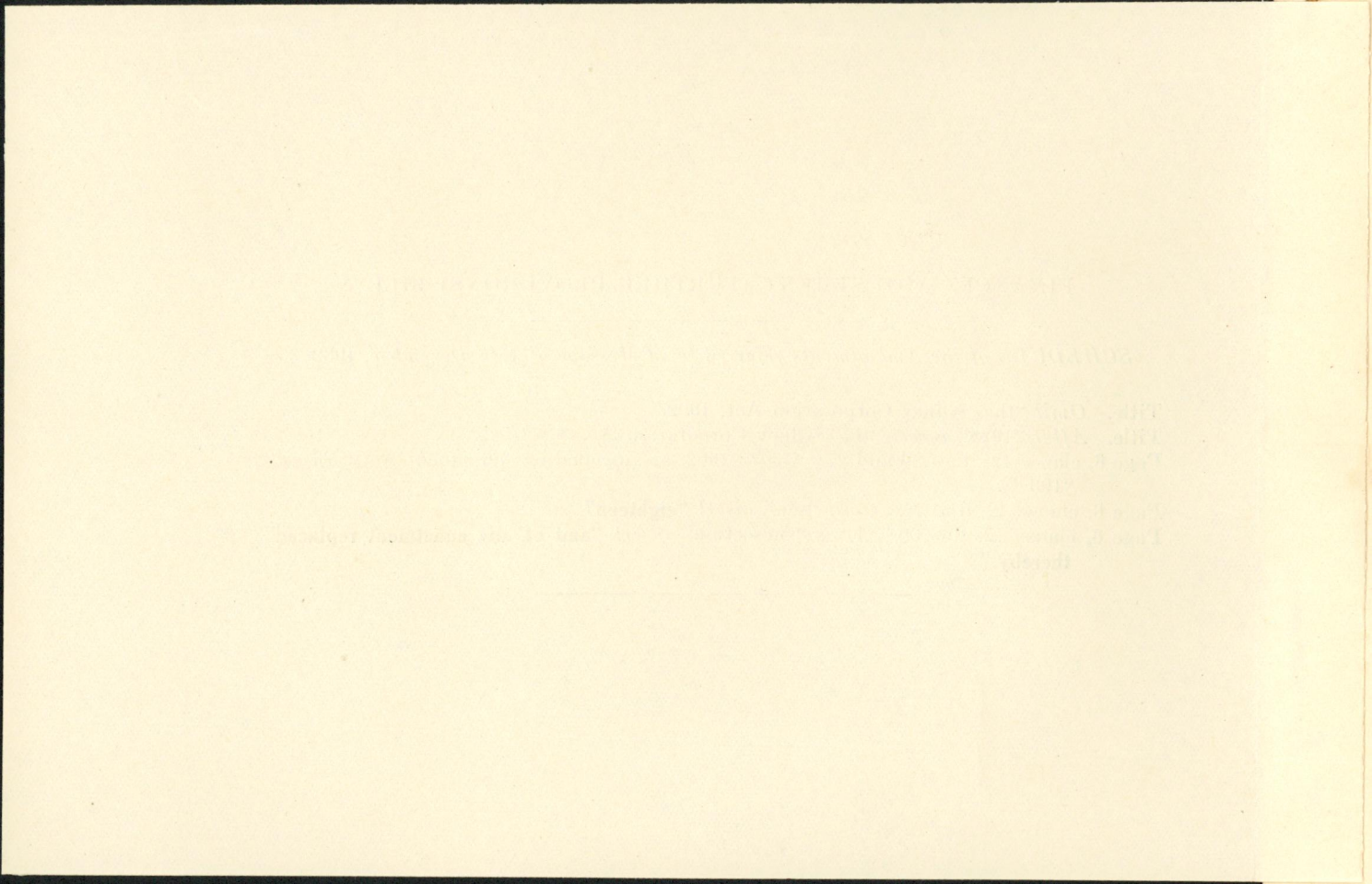

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

- 35 Forty pounds, plus text-books valued at one pound ten shillings, to thirty-one pounds and no text-books;
- 40 Fifty pounds, plus text-books valued at one pound ten shillings, to thirty-eight pounds and no text-books.
- 45 Sixty-five pounds, plus text-books valued at five pounds, to fifty pounds and no text-books.

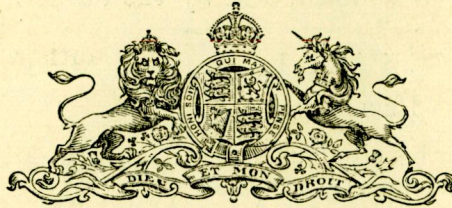

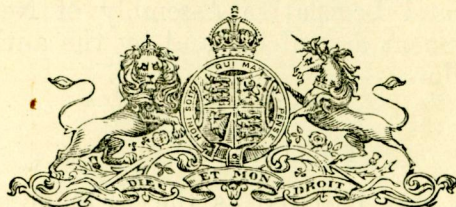
