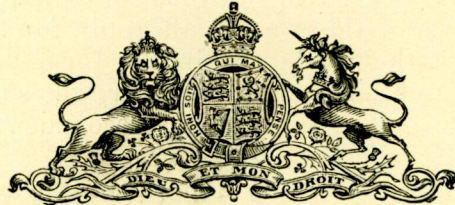

Act No. , 1932.

An Act to amend the law regarding subventions to Friendly Societies; and for this and other purposes to amend the Friendly Societies Act, 1912-1931, and certain other Acts; to repeal the Friendly Societies Subvention Act, 1931; and for purposes connected therewith.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Friendly Societies (Amendment) Act, 1932." Short title and citation.

Friendly Societies (Amendment).

(2) In this Act the Friendly Societies Act, 1912-1931, is referred to as the Principal Act.

(3) The Principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the Friendly Societies Act, 1912-1932.

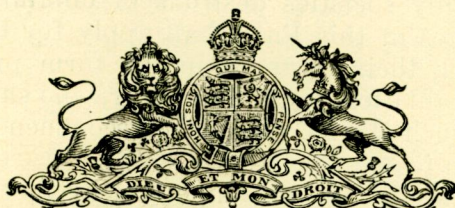

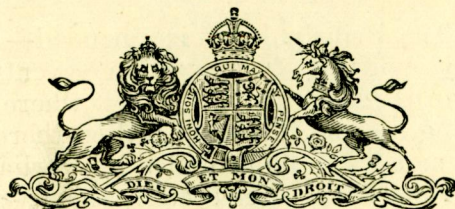
