And upon ceasing to be a member of the Legislative Council or a member of the Legislative Assembly, as the case may be, such person shall be entitled to receive a free pass under this subsection, and to hold and use the same for a term equal to such portion of the period during which he is entitled under paragraph (c) of this subsection to hold and use a free pass as was unexpired at the date upon which he became such member as aforesaid.

(f) Notwithstanding the provisions of the preceding sub-paragraphs of this subsection, any person who-

(i) takes any oath or makes any declaration or acknowledgment of allegiance, obedience, or adherence to any foreign prince or power; or

(ii) does, concurs in, or adopts any act whereby he may become a subject or citizen of any foreign state or power, or whereby he may become entitled to the rights, privileges, or immunities of a subject or citizen of any foreign state or power; or

(iii) is attainted of treason, or convicted of felony

or any infamous crime,

shall not be entitled to receive, or to hold or use any free pass under this subsection; and if any such free pass has previously been issued to him it shall forthwith be returned by him or his agent.
