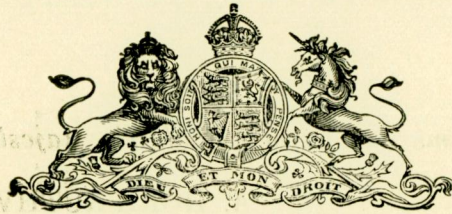

Act No. 22, 1935.

An Act to amend the Moratorium Act, 1932, in certain respects; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 5th April, 1935.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Moratorium Short title.
(Amendment) Act, 1935."

(2) The Moratorium Act, 1932, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

(3) The Principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the Moratorium Act, 1932-1935.

Amendment of Act No. 57, 1932.

2. The Principal Act is amended—

Sec. 18. (Prescribed date for repayment.)

(a) by omitting from section eighteen the word "thirty-six" wherever occurring and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "thirty-eight";

Sec. 49. (Duration of Part II.)

(b) by omitting from section forty-nine the word "thirty-six" wherever occurring and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "thirty-eight."

(3) The Principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the Moratorium Act 1932.

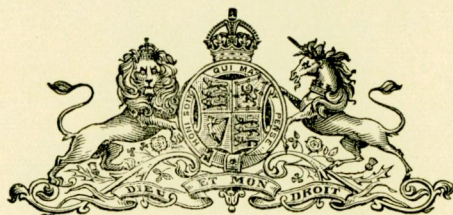
