Act No. 48, 1932.

An Act to reduce the allowances to Members of the Legislative Assembly and the salaries of Ministers of the Crown and of certain other persons; to amend the Constitution Act, 1902, as amended by subsequent Acts, and certain other Acts; to repeal the Parliamentary Allowances and Salaries Act, 1930; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 21st December, 1932.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Parliamentary Allowances and Salaries Act, 1932."

Parliamentary Allowances and Salaries.

(2) The Constitution Act, 1902, as amended by subsequent Acts, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

(3) This Act shall be deemed to have commenced on the first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two.

(c) by omitting from the said Third Schedule the figures "14,003 5 0" and by inserting in lieu thereof the figures "13,740 0 0."

7. The Parliamentary Allowances and Salaries Act, 1930, is hereby repealed.

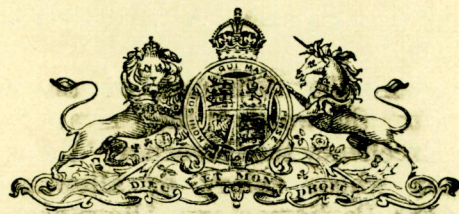
