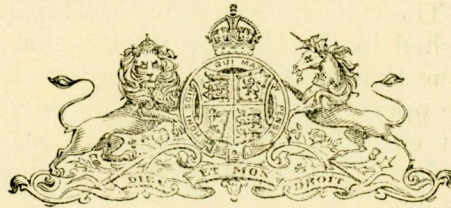

Act No. , 1934.

An Act to extend the operation of Part II of the Prevention and Relief of Unemployment Acts, 1930-1932, as amended by subsequent Acts.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of
5 the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Prevention and Relief of Unemployment (Amendment) Act, 1934." Short title.

(2) The Prevention and Relief of Unemployment Acts, 1930-1932, as amended by subsequent Acts and by
10 this Act, may be cited as the Prevention and Relief of Unemployment Act, 1930-1934.

Prevention and Relief of Unemployment (Amendment).

2. The Prevention and Relief of Unemployment Acts, 1930-1932, as amended by subsequent Acts, is amended by omitting section eleven and by inserting in lieu thereof the following new section:—

5 11. (1) This Part of this Act shall, unless the operation thereof is extended under subsection two of this section, cease to have effect on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.

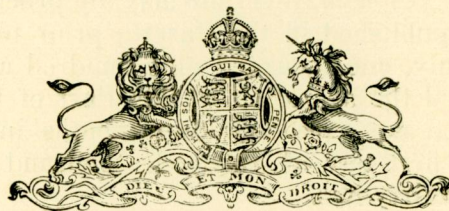
Duration of Part II.

10 (2) The Governor may, by proclamation made and published in the Gazette prior to the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, extend the operation of this Part of this Act for a period not exceeding four months in all after the said first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.

Act No. 25, 1934.

An Act to extend the operation of Part II of the Prevention and Relief of Unemployment Acts, 1930-1932, as amended by subsequent Acts. [Assented to, 9th November, 1934.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Prevention and Relief of Unemployment (Amendment) Act, 1934." Short title.

(2) The Prevention and Relief of Unemployment Acts, 1930-1932, as amended by subsequent Acts and by this Act, may be cited as the Prevention and Relief of Unemployment Act, 1930-1934.
