

Printing and Book Purchasers' Protection (Amendment) Bill.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

This Bill is designed to extend the provisions of the Printing Act requiring the name and address of a person responsible for printing any document to appear on documents produced by the typewriter, roneo or any other multigraph process. Such requirement will not be applied to circulars, etc., issued for trade purposes, but only to documents which are of a political, seditious or blasphemous nature.

Sedition is a misdemeanour at common law consisting of acts done, words spoken and published or writings capable of being a libel published in each case with a seditious intention.

A seditious intention is an intention-

- (1) to bring into hatred or contempt or to excite disaffection against the King or the Government and Constitution of the State or either House of the Legislature or the administration of justice; or
- (2) to excite the King's subjects to attempt, otherwise than by lawful means, the alteration of any matter in the State as by law established; or
- (3) to incite persons to commit any crime in general disturbance of the peace; or
- (4) to raise discontent or disaffection amongst His Majesty's subjects; or
- (5) to promote feelings of ill-will and hostility between different classes of such subjects.

Blasphemy is a misdemeanour at common law consisting of-

- (1) scoffingly or irreverently ridiculing the doctrines of the Christian faith; or
- (2) uttering or publishing contumelious reproaches of Jesus Christ; or
- (3) profane scoffing at the Holy Scriptures or exposing any part thereof to contempt or ridicule.

The opportunity is taken to adjust a difficulty which has arisen in the application of the Printing Act to firms and also to make certain minor revisions.

The Bill is further designed to restrict in some measure the operation of the Book Purchasers' Protection Act, 1899, both retrospectively and prospectively, by removing from its purview sales of books by wholesale, and contracts for printing and supply of books to be performed at a future date in cases in which the books are to be supplied for the purpose of sale or distribution by the purchaser.

This Public Bill originated in the Legislative Assembly, and, having this day passed, is now ready for presentation to the Legislative Council for its concurrence.
