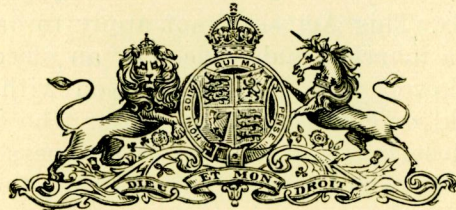

Act No. 27, 1935.

An Act to modify the operation of the Public Service Salaries Act, 1931-1934; to repeal and re-enact with certain amendments section forty-eight of the Public Service Act, 1902, as amended by subsequent Acts; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 11th April, 1935.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Public Service Short title. Salaries (Amendment) Act, 1935."

2. (1) The Public Service Salaries Act, 1931-1934, is amended—

This Act shall not apply to or in respect of a married male officer or an officer who is a widower or a divorced person with dependent child or children, or an officer who is a widow, a deserted wife, or a divorced person with dependent child or children, where the salary of such officer does not exceed the rate of three hundred pounds per annum.

(b) (i) by omitting subsection two of section four;
(ii) by omitting subsection seven of the same section and by inserting in lieu thereof the following subsection:—

Every officer classified in either of such divisions who is engaged in the performance of work entitling him for the time being to an annual salary of less than the amount ascertained as aforesaid, shall be deemed to be included in the lower grade of that division.
