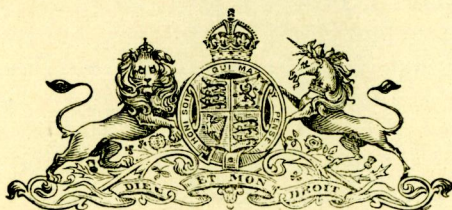

Act No. 16, 1933.

An Act to amend the Public Service Salaries Act, 1931-1933, in certain respects; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 5th December, 1933.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Public Service Salaries (Amendment) Act, 1933." Short title.

(2) The Public Service Salaries Act, 1931-1933, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the Public Service Salaries Acts, 1931-1933.

2. (1) The Public Service Salaries Act, 1931-1933, is amended by omitting subsection two of section four and by inserting in lieu thereof the following subsection:—

(2) (a) In the application of the provisions of this section to the case of a married male officer, or an officer who is a widower or a divorced person with dependent child or children, or an officer who is a widow, a deserted wife, or a divorced person with dependent child or children, the provisions of paragraphs (b), (c), and (d) of this subsection shall have effect.

(b) Where the salary of the officer does not exceed the rate of three hundred and twenty-five pounds per annum, the officer shall be entitled to a rebate from the deductions prescribed by this section of an amount in accordance with the following scale:—

Salary.	Amount of rebate from the deduction prescribed by section four.
Not exceeding the rate of two hundred pounds per annum.	Thirty pounds per annum.
In excess of two hundred pounds per annum and not exceeding two hundred and sixty-eight pounds per annum.	Twenty pounds per annum.
In excess of two hundred and sixty-eight pounds per annum and not exceeding two hundred and eighty pounds per annum.	Fifteen pounds per annum.
In excess of two hundred and eighty pounds per annum and not exceeding three hundred pounds per annum.	Ten pounds per annum.
In excess of three hundred pounds per annum and not exceeding three hundred and twenty-five pounds per annum.	Five pounds per annum.

(c)

Public Service Salaries (Amendment).

(c) Where the salary of the officer is in excess of the rate of two hundred pounds per annum, such salary shall not be reduced below two hundred pounds per annum; and where it is in excess of the rate of two hundred and sixty-eight pounds per annum it shall not be reduced below two hundred and forty-six pounds ten shillings per annum; and where it is in excess of the rate of two hundred and eighty pounds per annum it shall not be reduced below two hundred and fifty-one pounds per annum; and where it is in excess of the rate of three hundred pounds per annum it shall not be reduced below two hundred and sixty-two pounds ten shillings per annum; and where it is in excess of the rate of three hundred and twenty-five pounds per annum it shall not be reduced below two hundred and seventy-eight pounds ten shillings per annum.

(d) The provisions of this subsection shall not operate to entitle an officer to the payment of salary at a rate in excess of that which would have been payable if this section had not been enacted.

(2) The rebates referred to in paragraph (b) of subsection two of section four of the Public Service Salaries Act, 1931-1933, as amended by this Act, and any adjustments rendered necessary by the provisions of paragraph (c) of the said subsection two, shall be made in the case of each officer as from the commencement of the first pay period applicable to the officer in the month of November in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three.
