Act No. 34, 1935.

An Act to amend subsection two of section two of the Public Service Salaries (Amendment) Act, 1935; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 11th April, 1935.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Public Service Salaries (Further Amendment) Act, 1935." Short title.

2. The Public Service Salaries (Amendment) Act, 1935, is amended by omitting from subsection two of section two all words following the word "shall" and by inserting in lieu thereof the words "be deemed to have commenced upon the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five." Amendment of Public Service Salaries (Amendment) Act, 1935, s. 2 (2).

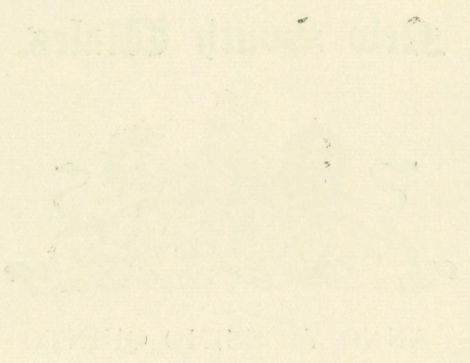
