(1) The Council of the Municipality of Ku-ring-gai may cause the remains of all persons buried in the lands described in the Schedule to this Act (so far as such remains can by reasonable diligence be discovered or identified) together with all slabs and tombstones in relation thereto, to be collected with due care and removed to another part of the cemetery attached to St. John's Church, at Gordon, and shall cause such remains to be reverently reinterred and such slabs or tombstones to be re-erected.

(2) 'The said council shall pay the cost of such removal, reinterment, and re-erection.

3. No compensation shall be payable by the said council to any person in respect of the performance of any act authorised by this Act.

SCHEDULE.

THAT portion of the cemetery attached to St. John's Church, at Gordon, vested in the Church of England Property Trust, Diocese of Sydney and proposed to be transferred therefrom to the Council of the Municipality of Ku-ring-gai for the purpose of widening St. John's Avenue, and more particularly described as follows :---
