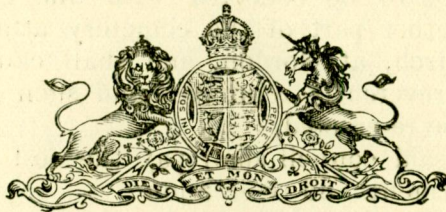

Act No. 37, 1932.

An Act to provide for the removal of human remains and certain slabs and tombstones from a portion of the cemetery attached to St. John's Church, at Gordon; for the reinterment of such remains, and the re-erection of such slabs and tombstones in another part of such cemetery; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 2nd December, 1932.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "St. John's Church Cemetery Act, 1932." Short title.

St. John's Church Cemetery.

Removal of
remains.

2. (1) The Council of the Municipality of Ku-ring-gai may cause the remains of all persons buried in the lands described in the Schedule to this Act (so far as such remains can by reasonable diligence be discovered or identified) together with all slabs and tombstones in relation thereto, to be collected with due care and removed to another part of the cemetery attached to St. John's Church, at Gordon, and shall cause such remains to be reverently reinterred and such slabs or tombstones to be re-erected.

Council to
pay cost.

(2) The said council shall pay the cost of such removal, reinterment, and re-erection.

Compensa-
tion not
payable.

3. No compensation shall be payable by the said council to any person in respect of the performance of any act authorised by this Act.

SCHEDULE.

THAT portion of the cemetery attached to St. John's Church, at Gordon, vested in the Church of England Property Trust, Diocese of Sydney and proposed to be transferred therefrom to the Council of the Municipality of Ku-ring-gai for the purpose of widening St. John's Avenue, and more particularly described as follows:—

All that piece or parcel of land containing by admeasurement $5\frac{3}{4}$ perches situate at Gordon, in the Municipality of Ku-ring-gai, Parish of Gordon, and County of Cumberland, being part of the land comprised in Certificate of Title Volume 124, Folio 205: Commencing at a point on the south-eastern side of St. John's Avenue, being a point bearing and distant 69 degrees 5 minutes 261 feet 2 inches from the intersection of that side of that Avenue and the north-east side of Oberon Crescent and bounded thence on the south-west and north-west by the north-eastern and south-eastern sides of St. John's Avenue aforesaid, bearing and distant respectively 351 degrees 18 minutes 27 feet 9 inches and 81 degrees 10 minutes 144 feet $4\frac{3}{4}$ inches, thence on the north-east by part of the north-eastern boundary of land comprised in Certificate of Title Volume 124, Folio 205, being a fenced line bearing and distant 171 degrees 18 minutes 8 feet 0 inches, and thence on the south-east by lines bearing and distant respectively 261 degrees 10 minutes 88 feet $4\frac{3}{4}$ inches 249 degrees 33 minutes 19 feet 7 inches and 237 degrees 56 minutes 40 feet $1\frac{1}{4}$ inches to the point of commencement.

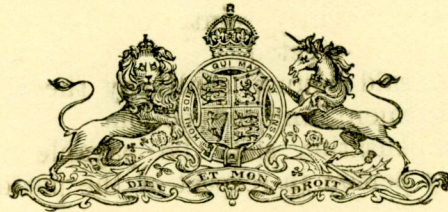

St. John's Church Cemetery.

2. (1) The Council of the Municipality of Ku-ring-gai may cause the remains of all persons buried in the lands described in the Schedule to this Act (so far as such remains can by reasonable diligence be discovered or identified) together with all slabs and tombstones in relation thereto, to be collected with due care and removed to another part of the cemetery attached to St. John's Church, at Gordon, and shall cause such remains to be reverently reinterred and such slabs or tombstones to be re-erected.

Removal of remains.

(2) The said council shall pay the cost of such removal, reinterment, and re-erection.
