Act No. 53, 1932.

An Act to alter the stamp duties payable in respect of agreements for the hire of motion picture films, and duplicates or counterparts of such agreements; to amend the Stamp Duties Act, 1920-1932; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 21st December, 1932.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Stamp Duties (Amendment) Act, 1932."

Stamp Duties (Amendment).

(2) This Act shall be deemed to have commenced upon the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one.

Charge of duties.

2. From and after the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, there shall be charged, levied, collected and paid under the provisions of the Stamp Duties Act, 1920-1932, as amended by this Act, for the use of His Majesty and for the credit of the Consolidated Revenue Fund in respect of the instruments referred to in section three of this Act, stamp duties at the several rates and of the several amounts and by the persons specified in that section in lieu of the stamp duties payable in respect of such instruments prior to the said date.

Amendment of Act No. 47, 1920. Second Schedule.

3. The Second Schedule to the Stamp Duties Act, 1920-1932, is amended—

(a) by inserting after paragraph eight of the matter appearing under the heading "Lease or Promise of or Agreement for Lease or Hire of any Property not being a Ship or Vessel" the following new paragraph:—

(9) Agreement for the hire of a motion picture film—

(a) where the amount of rental or hire payable does not exceed £1,000:—

For every £25 or part of £25 of such rental or hire.....

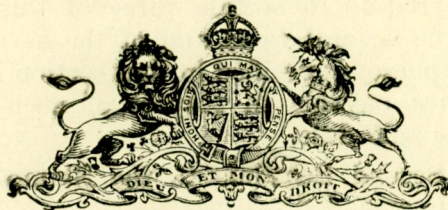
