An Act to make further provision relating to officers and servants of the Australian Museum; to amend the Australian Museum (Amendment) Act, 1931, and certain other Acts; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 9th April, 1936.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Australian Museum Short title. (Amendment) Act, 1936."

Citation of Act No. 61, 1902. 2. The Australian Museum Act, 1902, as amended by subsequent Acts and this Act, may be cited as the Australian Museum Act, 1902-1936.

Amendment of Act No. 39, 1931.

- 3. (1) The Australian Museum (Amendment) Act, 1931, is amended—
  - (a) by omitting from subsection one of section two the words "Such officers and servants shall be appointed under and be subject to" and by inserting in lieu thereof the words "Officers and servants shall be appointed or employed under and be subject to all";
  - (b) by inserting next after subsection two of the same section the following new subsections:—
    - (3) Any such officer or servant shall have and enjoy the same rights and privileges, if any, with regard to superannuation contributions and payments as if he had continued an officer or servant of the Museum, and for this purpose service as an officer or servant of the Museum shall count as continuous service under the Public Service Act, 1902.
    - (4) Service as an officer and/or servant of the Trustees of the Museum shall count as service for the purposes of section thirteen of the Public Service (Amendment) Act. 1919.
    - (5) No such officer or servant shall be entitled to claim benefits under the Public Service Act, 1902, as well as under any other Act in respect of the same period of service.
- (2) The amendments made by subsection one of this section shall be deemed to have commenced upon the second day of November, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one.
