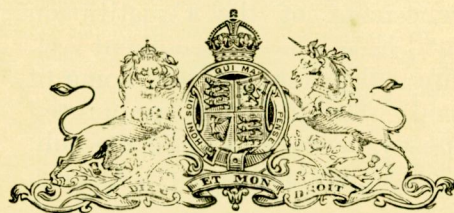

An Act to amend the Constitution (Legislative Council Elections) Act, 1932-1933, in certain respects; and for purposes connected therewith.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Constitution Short title.
(Legislative Council Elections) Amendment Act, 1937."

(2) The Constitution (Legislative Council Elections) Act, 1932-1933, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the Constitution (Legislative Council Elections) Act, 1932-1937.

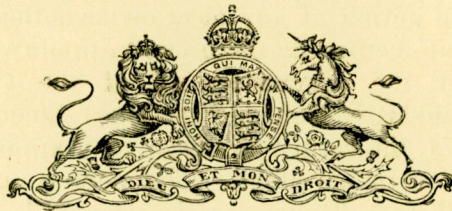
