Act No. 18, 1936.

An Act to make provision for the payment of a pension to the Vice-President of the Maritime Services Board of New South Wales; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 19th June, 1936.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Maritime Services Short title.
(Pension of Vice-President) Act, 1936."

2. In this Act "The Commonwealth Act" means the Superannuation Act, 1922-1930, of the Parliament of the Commonwealth of Australia, and includes any Act amending or replacing that Act.

"The Superannuation Fund" means the Superannuation Fund established under the Commonwealth Act.

Pension
provisions.

3. (1) (a) Captain George Davies Williams, Vice-President of the Maritime Services Board of New South Wales, shall, upon ceasing to contribute to the Superannuation Fund, pay from time to time to the Colonial Treasurer such amounts as would have been payable by him to the Superannuation Fund if he had continued to be a contributor within the meaning of the Commonwealth Act for the number of units of pension for which he was contributing at the date of his appointment as a Commissioner of The Maritime Services Board of New South Wales.

(b) Captain George Davies Williams shall within fourteen days after receipt by him of the amount of the refund of actual contributions paid by him to the Superannuation Fund pay such amount to the Colonial Treasurer.

(2) If the said Captain George Davies Williams complies with the provisions of subsection one of this section, such amounts by way of pension and other benefits as would have been payable out of the Superannuation Fund to him or to any other person if—

- (a) he had continued to be a contributor within the meaning of the Commonwealth Act,
- (b) no such refund of actual contributions as is referred to in paragraph (b) of subsection one of this section had been made,
- (c) the amounts paid by him under paragraph (a) of subsection one of this section had been paid by him as a contributor to the Superannuation Fund pursuant to the Commonwealth Act,

(d) his service as a Commissioner of The Maritime Services Board of New South Wales had been service as an employee within the meaning of the Commonwealth Act,
shall be paid out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund to him or to such other person.

3. (1) (a) Captain George Davies Williams, Vice-President of the Maritime Services Board of New South Wales, shall, upon ceasing to contribute to the Superannuation Fund, pay from time to time to the Colonial Treasurer such amounts as would have been payable by him to the Superannuation Fund if he had continued to be a contributor within the meaning of the Commonwealth Act for the number of units of pension for which he was contributing at the date of his appointment as a Commissioner of The Maritime Services Board of New South Wales.

(b) Captain George Davies Williams shall within fourteen days after receipt by him of the amount of the refund of actual contributions paid by him to the Superannuation Fund pay such amount to the Colonial Treasurer.

(2) If the said Captain George Davies Williams complies with the provisions of subsection one of this section, such amounts by way of pension and other benefits as would have been payable out of the Superannuation Fund to him or to any other person if—

- (a) he had continued to be a contributor within the meaning of the Commonwealth Act,
- (b) no such refund of actual contributions as is referred to in paragraph (b) of subsection one of this section had been made,
- (c) the amounts paid by him under paragraph (a) of subsection one of this section had been paid by him as a contributor to the Superannuation Fund pursuant to the Commonwealth Act,

shall be paid out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund to him or to such other person.
