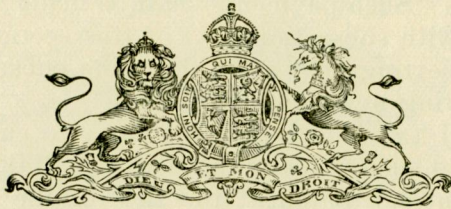

Act No. 49, 1936.

An Act to authorise the Milk Board to make certain payments to dairymen in respect of milk delivered by them to the Milk Board; to validate certain payments made by the Milk Board to dairymen; for these purposes to amend the Milk Act, 1931, in certain respects; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 1st December, 1936.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Milk (Amendment) Act, 1936." Short title

2. (1) The Milk Act, 1931, is amended—

- (a) by omitting from subsection two of section twenty-eight the words “on the basis of the minimum price or prices notified in relation thereto” and by inserting in lieu thereof the words “Such payments shall be made in accordance with subsection (2A) of this section”;
- (b) by inserting next after the same subsection the following new subsection:—

(2A) (a) The Board shall pay to each dairyman, at such times as the Board shall think fit, an amount calculated at the rate of the minimum price or prices applicable to or in respect of the milk delivered by such dairyman.

(b) Where, in respect of any period which the Board may think fit to adopt, the Board has, out of the proceeds of milk delivered by dairymen at any particular place at which milk is accepted by the Board—

(i) made the payments referred to in paragraph (a) of this subsection; and

(ii) made such provision for the matters referred to in subsection two of this section (other than expenses of administration) as the Board deems reasonably appropriate to and in respect of the milk so delivered,

the Board shall distribute, among such dairymen in proportion to the quantity of milk delivered by each of them at such place during such period, so much of the balance, if any, of such proceeds as the Board may determine to be available for the purpose.

(2) Subsection one of this section shall be deemed to have commenced upon the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two.

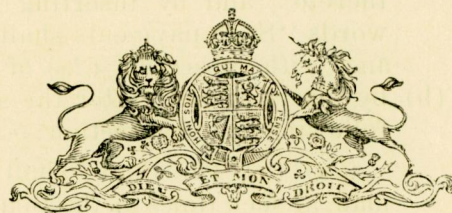

2. (1) The Milk Act, 1931, is amended—

- (a) by omitting from subsection two of section twenty-eight the words “on the basis of the minimum price or prices notified in relation thereto” and by inserting in lieu thereof the words “Such payments shall be made in accordance with subsection (2A) of this section”;
- (b) by inserting next after the same subsection the following new subsection:—

(b) Where, in respect of any period which the Board may think fit to adopt, the Board has, out of the proceeds of milk delivered by dairymen at any particular place at which milk is accepted by the Board—

- (ii) made such provision for the matters referred to in subsection two of this section (other than expenses of administration) as the Board deems reasonably appropriate to and in respect of the milk so delivered,
