Savings as to certain mortgages.

- 2. The Conveyancing Act, 1919-1938, is amended by inserting next after section one hundred and nine the following new section:—
  - 109A. (1) A mortgage of land which confers on the mortgagee a power to sever and sell fixtures apart from the balance of the mortgaged property, shall not be, and shall be deemed never to have been, merely because of such power—
    - (a) a bill of sale; or
    - (b) subject to avoidance or invalidity under the Bills of Sale Act of 1898, as amended by subsequent Acts, or under the Companies (Registration of Securities) Act, 1918, or under Part IX of the Companies Act, 1936, by reason of such mortgage not having been filed or registered under the provisions of any such Act.
  - (2) This section applies to mortgages and incumbrances under the Real Property Act, 1900.
  - (3) This section applies to mortgages and incumbrances made either before or after the commencement of the Conveyancing (Amendment) Act, 1939.
