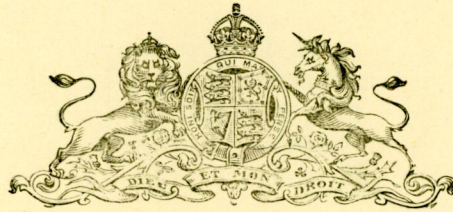

Act No. 1940.

An Act to enable the Registered Club known as the New South Wales Gun Club to remove its club premises to certain land; for this purpose to amend subsections three and four of section eighty of the Liquor Act, 1912, as amended by subsequent Acts, in certain respects; and for purposes connected therewith.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "New South Wales Short title Gun Club Act, 1940."

(2) This Act shall be read and construed with the Liquor Act, 1912, as amended by subsequent Acts.

2. (1) If at any time within eighteen months after the commencement of this Act application is duly made under section one hundred and forty-five of the Liquor Act, 1912, as amended by subsequent Acts, for the removal of the
 5 club premises of the registered club known as the New South Wales Gun Club from the land occupied as club premises by that club immediately before the commencement of this Act to the land described in the Schedule to this Act, or any part of such land, the provisions of
 10 section eighty of the Liquor Act, 1912, as amended by subsequent Acts, shall not operate to preclude the grant of the application, or the carrying out of the removal pursuant to such grant.
