## Public Health (Amendment) Bill, 1938.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE.

I'ніs Bill amends the Public Health (Amendment) Act, 1937, by adding a new section 12 to that Act.

The new section contains provisions as to the date upon which proclamations made under the Act are to take effect, and affords either House of Parliament the opportunity of disallowing the whole or any part of a proclamation.

## A BILL

To amend the Public Health (Amendment) Act, 1937, in certain respects; and for purposes connected therewith.

[Mr. FitzSimons;—15 July, 1938.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of 5 the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Public Health Short title. (Amendment) Act, 1938."

Amendment of Act No. 1, 1937. New. s. 12. 2. The Public Health (Amendment) Act, 1937, is amended by inserting next after section eleven the following new section:—

Disallowance of proclamation.

- 12. Any proclamation made under this Act shall—
  - (a) take effect from the date of publication in 5 the Gazette or from a later date to be specified in the proclamation; and
  - (b) be laid before both Houses of Parliament within fourteen sitting days after publication if Parliament is in session, and, if not, 10 then within fourteen sitting days after the commencement of the next session.

If either House of Parliament passes a resolution of which notice has been given within fifteen sitting days after any proclamation has been laid before such House disallowing such proclamation or any part thereof such proclamation or part shall thereupon cease to have effect.
