An Act to provide for the removal of human remains and certain slabs and tombstones from a portion of the cemetery attached to St. Anne's Church of England, at Ryde, for the reinterment of such remains and the re-erection of such slabs and tombstones in the Field of Mars Church of England Cemetery at Ryde; and for purposes connected therewith

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "St. Anne's Church of England (Ryde) Cemetery Act, 1940." Short title.

St. Anne's Church of England (Ryde) Cemetery.

2. (1) The Commissioner for Main Roads appointed under the Transport (Division of Functions) Act, 1932, may cause the remains of all persons buried in the lands described in the Schedule to this Act (so far as such
5 remains can by reasonable diligence be discovered or identified), together with all slabs or tombstones in relation thereto, to be collected with due care and removed from the lands described in the Schedule to this Act to the Field of Mars Church of England
10 Cemetery at Ryde, and shall cause such remains to be reverently reinterred and such slabs or tombstones to be re-erected.

Removal of remains.

(2) The cost of removing and reintering such remains and of removing and re-erecting such slabs and
15 tombstones shall be paid from the County of Cumberland Main Roads Fund under the Main Roads Act, 1924-1939.

3. No compensation shall be payable to any person in respect of the performance of any act authorised by this

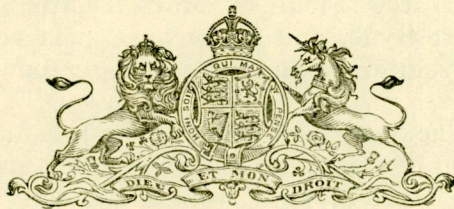

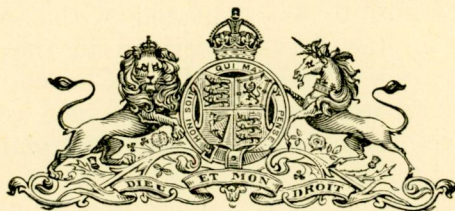
