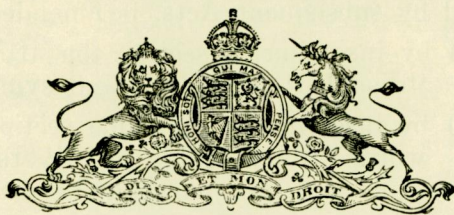

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Act No. 1, 1944.

An Act to make certain provisions in relation to members of the police force who are killed or injured whilst travelling to or from duty and members and certain ex-members of the police force who die from injuries so received; for this purpose to amend the Police Regulation (Superannuation) Act, 1906, as amended; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 22nd March, 1944.]

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

**1.** (1) This Act may be cited as the "Police Regulation (Superannuation) Amendment Act, 1944."

(b) by any wound or injury received, without his own default or wilful act, on any of the daily or other periodic journeys referred to in section 10A of this Act, which wound or injury is not received—

(i) during or after any substantial interruption of, or substantial deviation from, any such journey made for a reason unconnected with his duty; or

(ii) during or after any other break in any such journey which, having regard to all the circumstances, is not reasonably incidental to any such journey.”

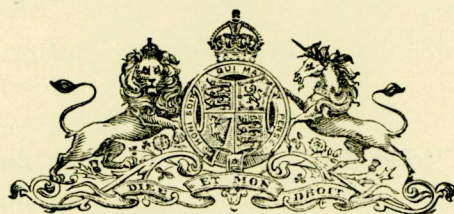
