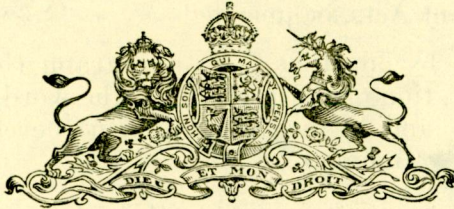

An Act to increase the rate of pension provided by the Widows' Pensions Act, 1925-1937, as amended by subsequent Acts; to amend the Widows' Pensions Act, 1925-1937, and certain other Acts in certain respects; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 16th June, 1942.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Widows' Pensions (Amendment) Act, 1942."

Short title, citation, and commencement.

(2) The Widows' Pensions Act, 1925-1937, as amended by subsequent Acts and by this Act, may be cited as the "Widows' Pensions Act, 1925-1942."

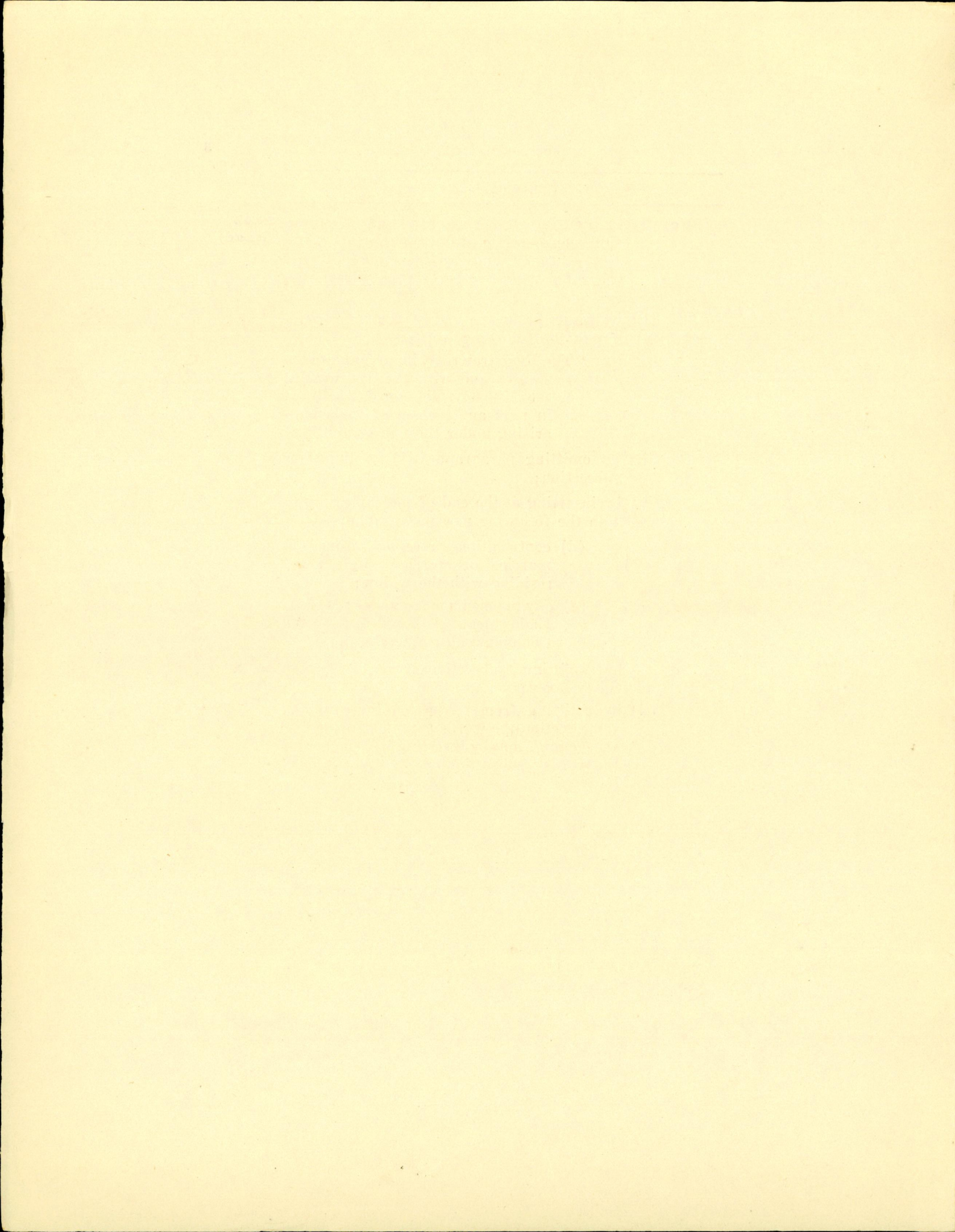
