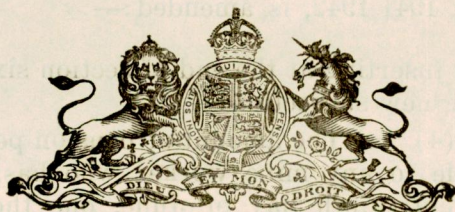

An Act to increase the rates of pensions payable under the Coal and Oil Shale Mine Workers (Pensions) Act, 1941-1942; to make further provisions as to the granting of such pensions and the contributions to the Funds established under the said Act; for these and other purposes to amend the said Act in certain respects; to validate certain matters; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 28th March, 1947.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Coal and Oil Shale Mine Workers (Pensions) Amendment Act, 1947." Short title and citation.

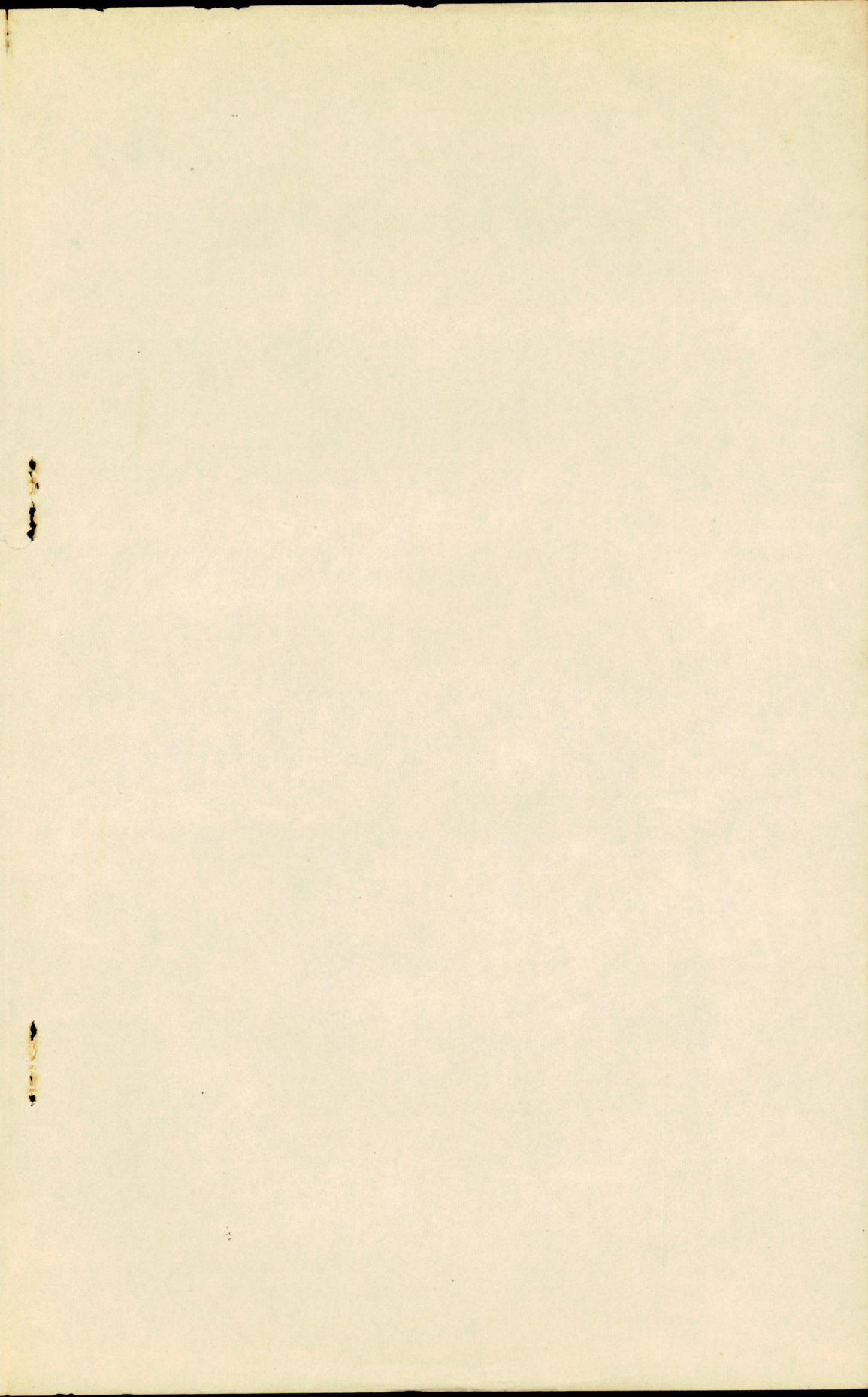

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE object of this Bill is to amend the Coal and Oil Shale **Mine Workers (Pensions) Act, 1941-1942**, for the purposes of:—

- (i) Giving effect to the Agreement between the Federal and State Governments whereunder the Chairman of the Joint Coal Board shall be, *ex officio*, Chairman of the Coal and Oil Shale Mine Workers **Pensions Tribunal**.
- (ii) Increasing the rates of pensions and certain allowances **at present payable** under that Act.
- (iii) Providing means whereby the additional revenue required to pay such **increase in rates will be obtained**.

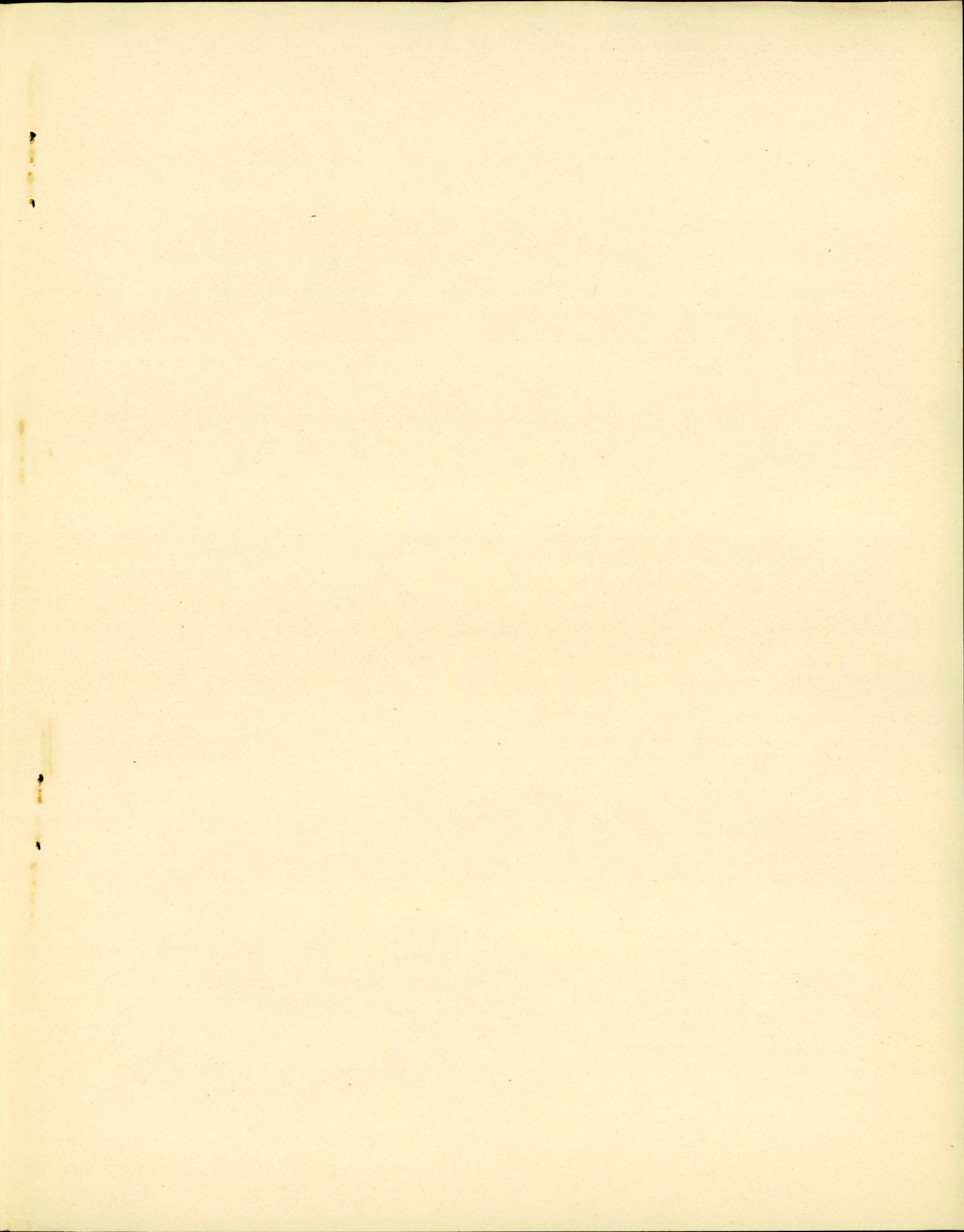
