An Act to sanction and to provide for the construction of a dam across the Hunter River at Glenbawn and works incidental thereto; to amend the Public Works Act, 1912, in certain respects; and for purposes connected therewith.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Glenbawn Dam Act, Short title. 1946."

Glenbawn Dam.

2. (1) (a) The carrying out of the work described in the Schedule to this Act is hereby sanctioned. Work sanctioned.

(b) The said work shall be deemed to be an authorised work within the meaning of the Public Works Act, 1912, as amended by subsequent Acts.

(c) The Water Conservation and Irrigation Commission is empowered to carry out the said work, and shall be the constructing authority for the same within the meaning of the said Act, as so amended, and shall enter into such contracts and take all such necessary steps for the proper execution thereof as such authority may think proper.

(d) The provisions of the Public Works Act, 1912, as amended by subsequent Acts, sections thirty-four, thirty-five, thirty-six and thirty-seven excepted, shall apply to and in respect of the said work.

(2) Without prejudice to the generality of subsection one of this section the provisions of section thirty-eight of the Public Works Act, 1912, as amended by subsequent Acts, shall apply to and in respect of any contracts referred to in paragraph (c) of subsection one of this section.

3. The plan of the said work is the plan marked "Hunter River Proposed Glenbawn Dam," sealed with the Seal of the Water Conservation and Irrigation Commission, and deposited in the head office of the said Commission. The plan.

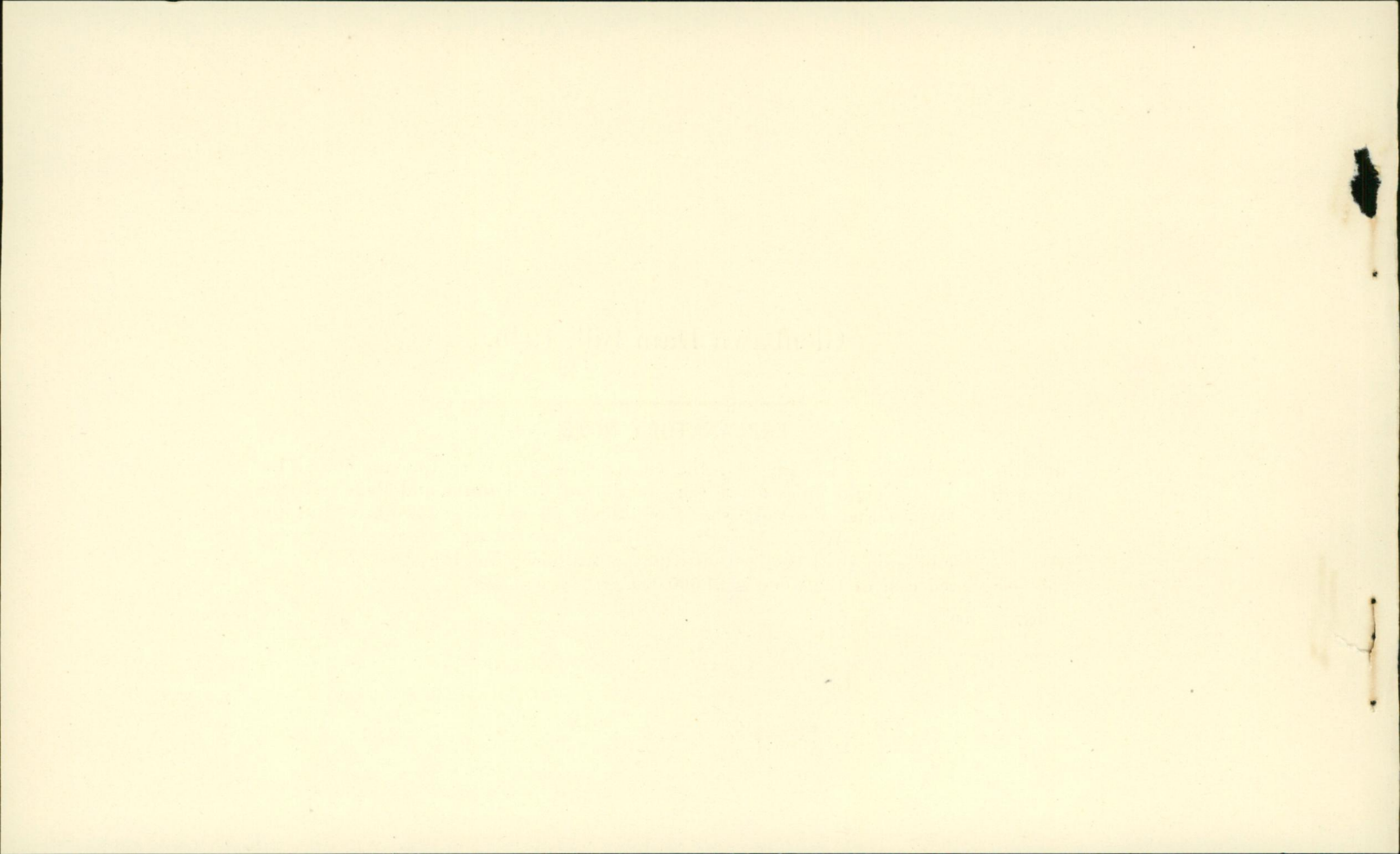
Glenbawn Dam Bill, 1946.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE Bill sanctions and provides for the construction of an earth dam across the Hunter River about eight miles above the junction of the Hunter and Page's Rivers.

The Bill provides that the work shall be deemed an authorised work within the meaning of the Public Works Act, 1912, and that the Water Conservation and Irrigation Commission shall be the Constructing Authority for the same.

The estimated cost of the work is £1,500,000.
