An Act to amend the Parliamentary Electorates and Elections Act, 1912-1944, in certain respects; and for purposes connected therewith.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Parliamentary Elections (Neutral Bay By-Election) Act, 1945." Short title and construction.

(2) This Act shall be read and construed with the Parliamentary Electorates and Elections Act, 1912-1944.

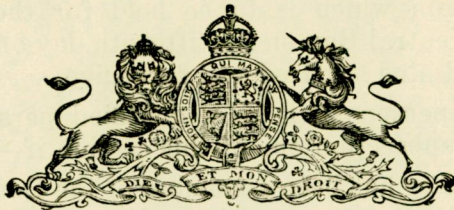

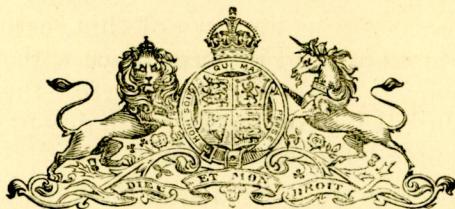
