(la) for the regulation of the business of manufacturing or repairing bedding, upholstery, or any similar articles, and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing provisions, for securing the cleanliness according to the standard prescribed of flock and other filling materials used for or in connection with the conduct of any such business, and for prohibiting any person engaged in any such business from storing or having on premises used for or in connection with the conduct of any such business any flock or other filling materials which are not clean according to the standard prescribed.


