An Act to make certain provisions relating to the home delivery of certain commodities; for this purpose to amend the Factories and Shops Acts, 1912-1946; and for purposes connected therewith.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Factories and Shops (Home Deliveries) Amendment Act, 1948."

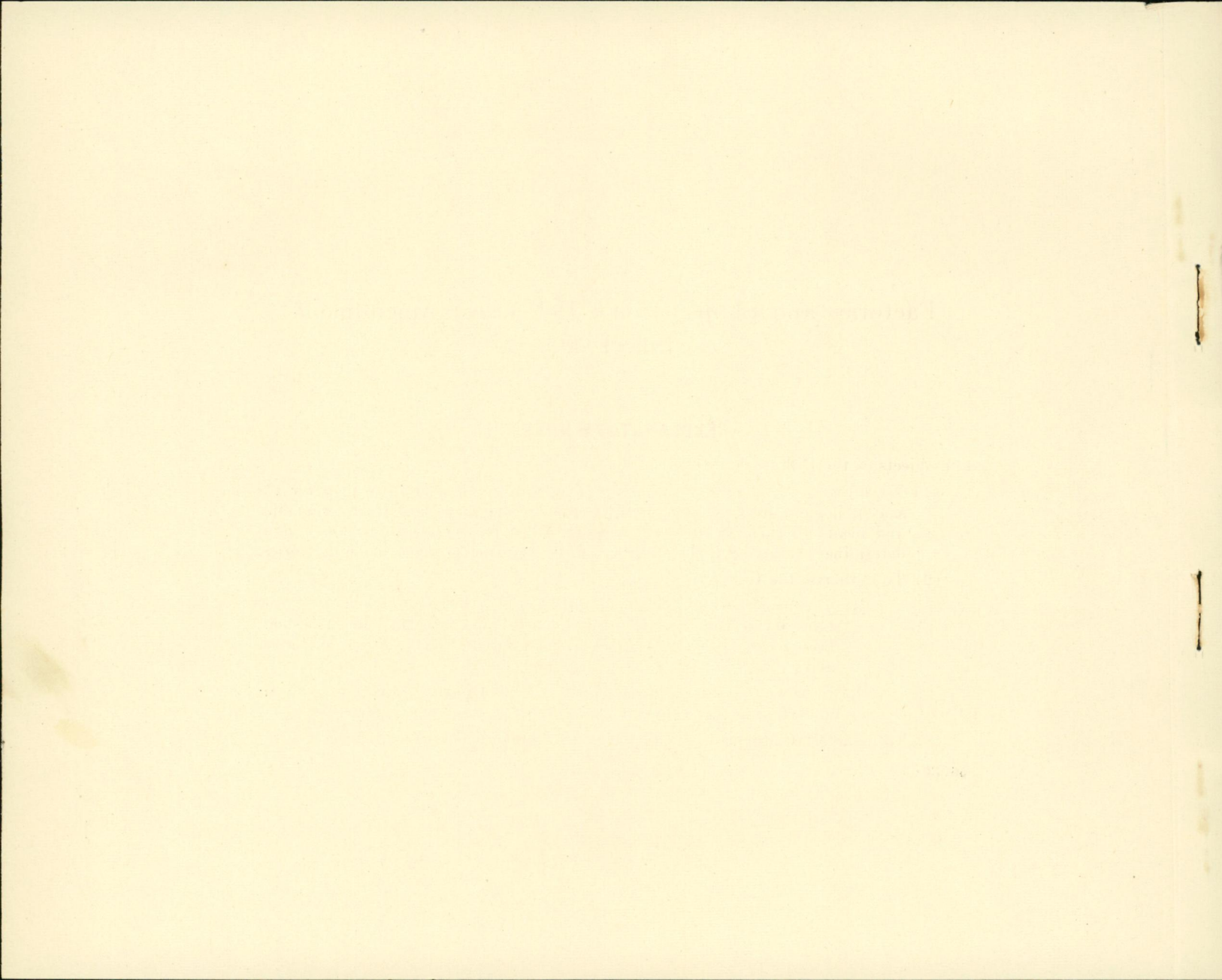

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE objects of the Bill are:—

- (1) To authorise the Under Secretary to require a shopkeeper of a shop for the sale of home delivery commodities (which include groceries, fruit, vegetables and meat) to furnish him with the prescribed particulars to enable him to determine whether such shopkeeper shall be required to make home deliveries.
- (2) To authorise the Under Secretary :
 - (a) to cancel the registration of the shop of a shopkeeper who has been required to make home deliveries where he is satisfied that such shopkeeper has without reasonable excuse failed to make home deliveries, and
 - (b) to refuse to register any shop if the shopkeeper refuses to give an undertaking that he will make home deliveries if so required.
- (3) To make other provisions incidental to the foregoing matters.

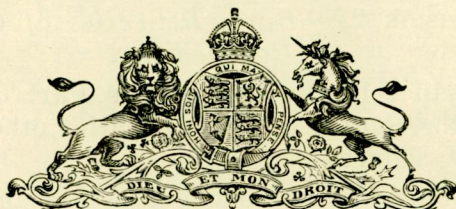
