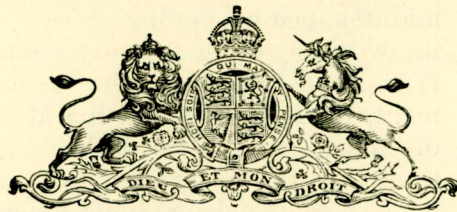

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of

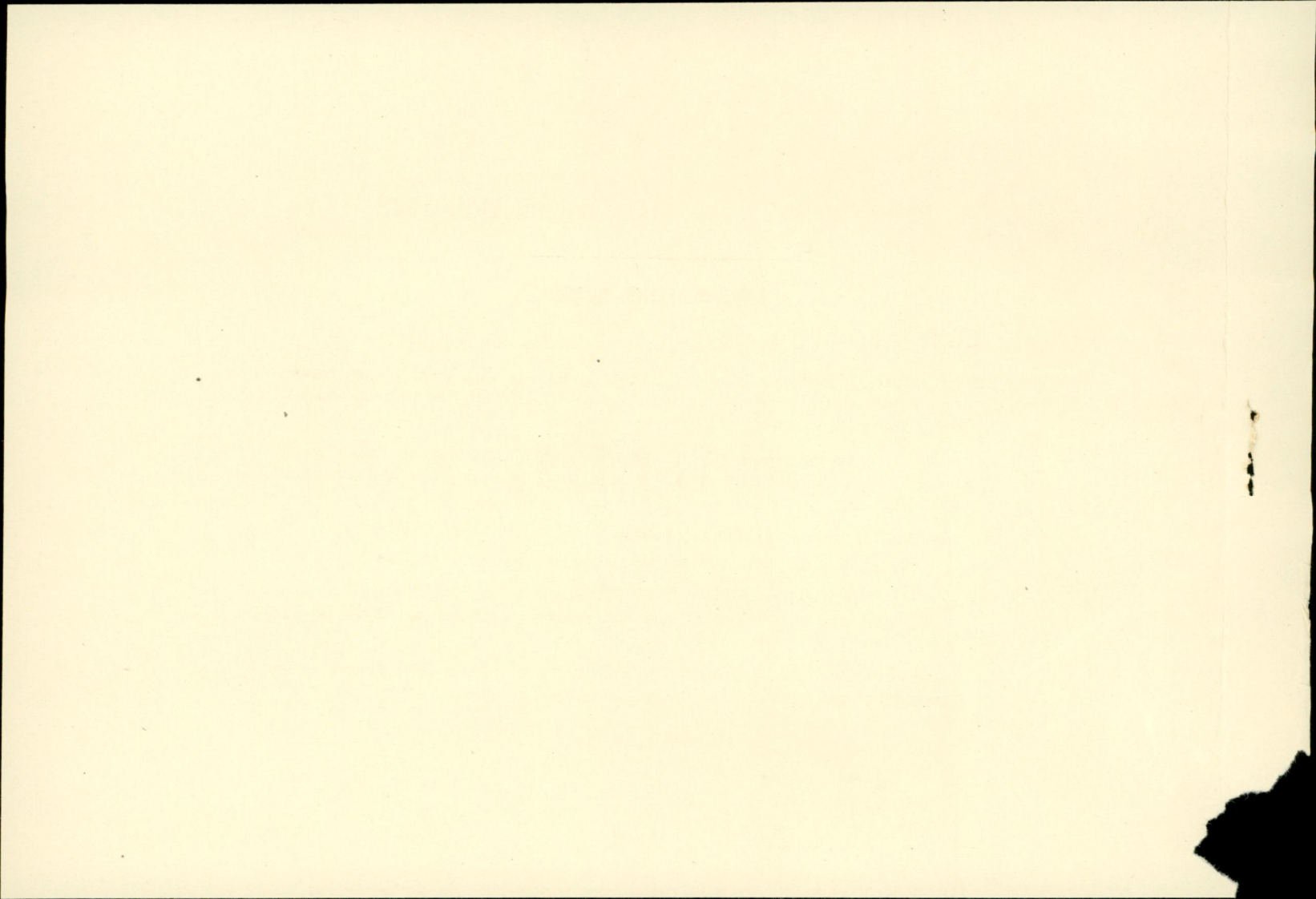

Friendly Societies (Amendment) Bill, 1948.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE objects of this Bill are to enlarge the powers of friendly societies by—

- (a) authorising friendly societies to establish, manage and maintain homes, refuges or other institutions for the accommodation, relief and care of members and other specified persons;
- (b) enabling a registered society to subscribe out of any surplus funds in its medical and management or benevolent fund to charitable and provident purposes;
- (c) enabling the limit of benefit payments—
 - (i) by way of gross sum to be increased from £200 to £500,
 - (ii) by way of annuity to be increased from £50 to £104,
 - (iii) by way of sick pay to be increased from £2 2s. 0d. to £5 5s. 0d. per week;
- (d) increasing the limit of benefits payable upon the death of children under ten years of age.
