- (d) providing for the making of periodical payments by banks of amounts equivalent to the value of stamps impressed in pursuance of any such authority;
- (e) prescribing for the purposes of this subsection the procedure to be followed by banks and persons printing forms of bills of exchange for and on the order of any bank and for such purposes requiring the prescribed returns and information to be furnished to the Commissioner.

Any bills of exchange upon which stamps have been impressed in accordance with the provisions of the regulations made under this subsection shall be deemed to be duly stamped.
