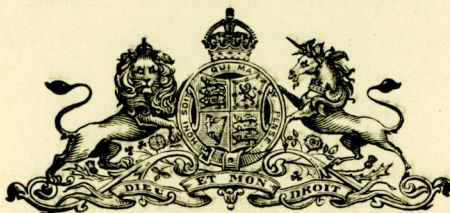

An Act to make provision for and in respect to the payment of gratuities to certain officers of The Commissioner for Road Transport and Tramways; for this purpose to amend the Transport Act, 1930-1945, in certain respects; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 21st May, 1948.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Transport (Officers Gratuities) Amendment Act, 1948." Short title, citation and commencement.

(1) This section shall apply to and in respect of officers who have had not less than ten years' service and who throughout such service have not been contributors to any superannuation fund or account established under this Act, the Government Railways Act, 1912-1945, or the Superannuation Act, 1916-1944.

(2) Any officer to whom this section applies shall, if he is retired otherwise than by reason of total incapacity for work and is at the date of such retirement under the age of sixty years, be entitled to a gratuity equivalent to the amount of one week's salary or wages for each complete year of service.

No gratuity payable under this subsection shall exceed an amount equivalent to thirteen weeks' salary or wages of the officer entitled to such gratuity.

(3) Any officer to whom this section applies shall—

(a) if he is retired otherwise than by reason of total incapacity for work and is at the date of such retirement of or over the age of sixty years; or

(b) if he is retired by reason of total incapacity for work irrespective of his age at the date of such retirement,

be entitled to a gratuity equivalent to the amount of two weeks' salary or wages for each complete year of service.

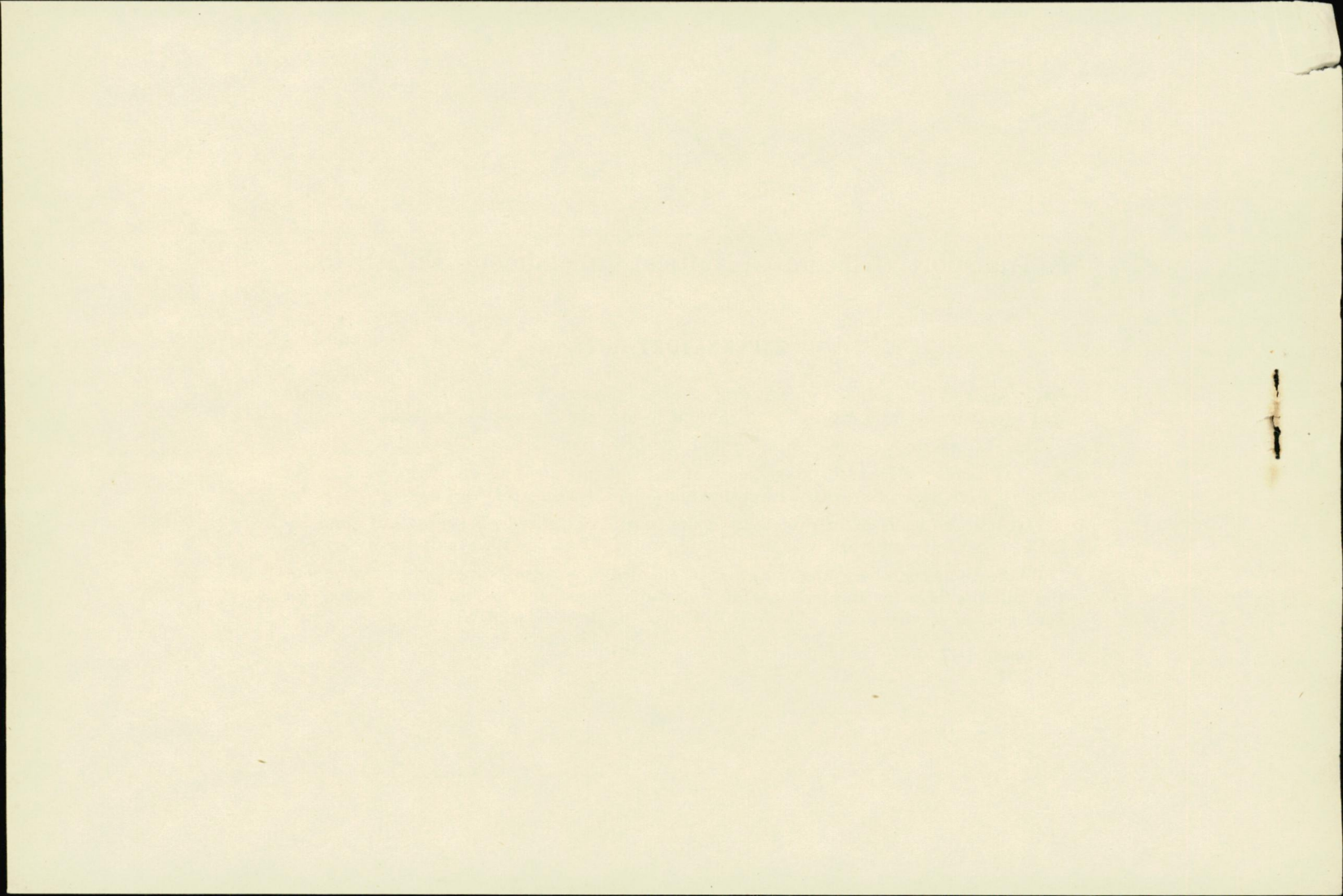
EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE object of this Bill is to grant gratuities to officers who have had ten years service and upwards and who are not contributors to any superannuation scheme.

The gratuity to any such officer retired from the transport service shall—

- (a) where he is under sixty years of age be equivalent to one week's salary for each year of service with a maximum of thirteen weeks' salary;
- (b) where he is of or over sixty years of age or retired on account of total incapacity for work be equivalent to two weeks' salary for each year of service.

Where an officer who would otherwise be entitled to a gratuity dies before retirement the Bill provides for the payment of a gratuity equivalent to two weeks' salary for each year of service to his widow or dependent children or relatives.



Transport (Officers Gratuities) Amendment Bill, 1948.

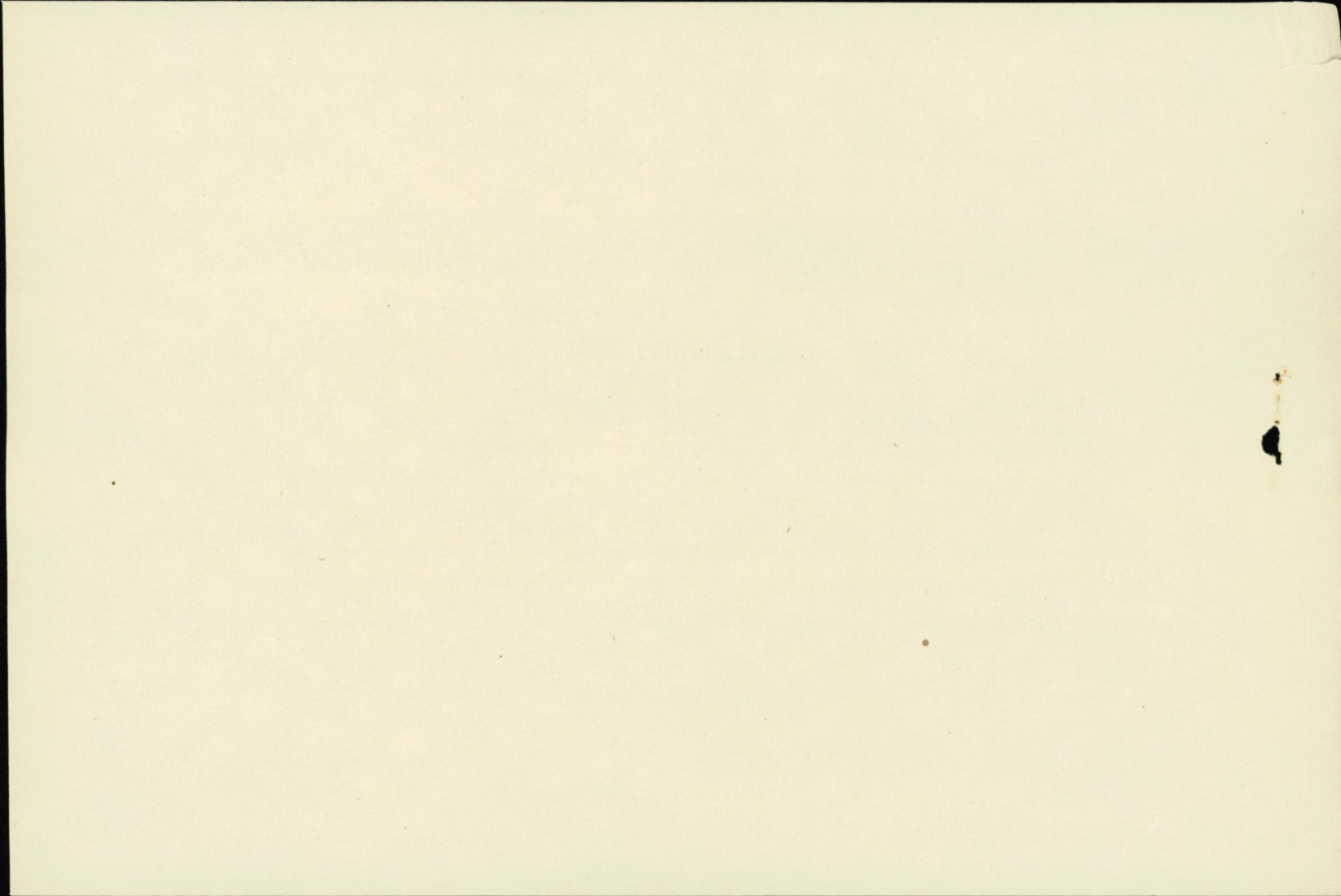
EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE object of this Bill is to grant gratuities to officers who have had ten years service and upwards and who are not contributors to any superannuation scheme.

The gratuity to any such officer retired from the transport service shall—

- (a) where he is under sixty years of age be equivalent to one week's salary for each year of service with a maximum of thirteen weeks' salary;
- (b) where he is of or over sixty years of age or retired on account of total incapacity for work be equivalent to two weeks' salary for each year of service.

Where an officer who would otherwise be entitled to a gratuity dies before retirement the Bill provides for the payment of a gratuity equivalent to two weeks' salary for each year of service to his widow or dependent children or relatives.
