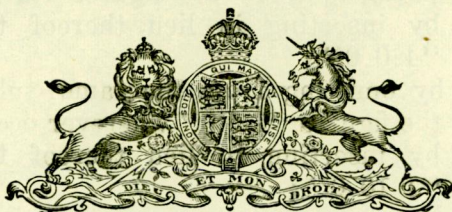

An Act to increase the amounts payable by way of compensation under the Workmen's Compensation (Broken Hill) Act, 1920-1945; to amend the said Act in certain respects; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 22nd April, 1948.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—
