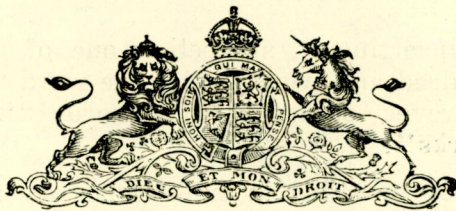

Act No. 5, 1952.

An Act to amend the Hunter District Water, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1938-1945, in certain respects; to validate certain matters; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 17th April, 1952.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Hunter District Water, Sewerage and Drainage (Amendment) Act, 1952." Short title and citation.
