EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE object of this Bill is to empower councils and county councils to expend funds in promoting the success of the forthcoming Royal visit.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT AND LOCAL AUTHORITIES ACT 1972

SECTION 105

Power to make bye-laws for the regulation of the use of land

105(1) A local authority may make bye-laws for the regulation of the use of land in the area of the authority.
