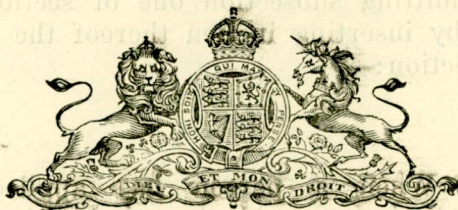

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

### EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE objects of this Bill are—

- (1) to remove the restrictions imposed by section 18 (6) of the Medical Practitioners Act, 1938-1946, upon the New South Wales Medical Board in respect of the registration of persons who are not natural born British subjects;
- (2) to enable the New South Wales Medical Board to grant certificates of provisional registration to graduands of any University in the Commonwealth of Australia.
