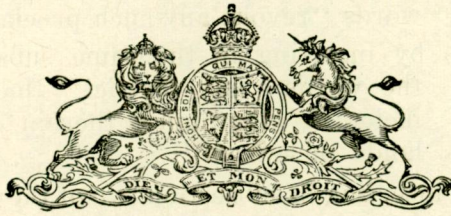

An Act to make provision for the revocation of proclamations establishing mine subsidence insurance districts; to enable other lands to be included therein and lands to be excluded therefrom; for these and other purposes to amend the Mine Subsidence Act, 1928-1948; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 27th June, 1951.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

(2) The amendments made by subsection one of this section shall not operate to affect the right of any person to claim compensation in accordance with the provisions of section twelve of the Mine Subsidence Act, 1928-1951, in respect of damage caused before any proclamation under section three of the said Act revoking any mine subsidence insurance district or varying the boundaries of any mine subsidence insurance district by the exclusion of lands therefrom has taken effect.

Any person who immediately before the date on which any such proclamation takes effect was the holder of a subsisting certificate of insurance under the said Act shall for the purposes of this subsection be deemed to be the holder of a subsisting certificate of insurance.
