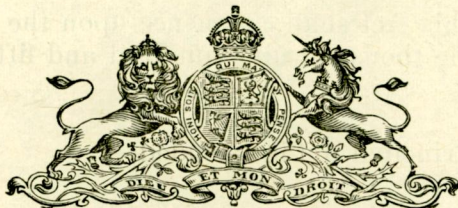

Act No. 63, 1951.

An Act to make further provision with regard to the allowances to Members of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly, and the salaries of Ministers of the Crown and of certain other persons; to amend the Constitution Act, 1902, the Parliamentary Allowances and Salaries Act, 1947, and certain other Acts; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 28th December, 1951.]

Parliamentary Allowances and Salaries.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Parliamentary Allowances and Salaries Act, 1951".

(2) The Constitution Act, 1902, as amended by subsequent Acts, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

(3) This Act shall commence upon the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-two.

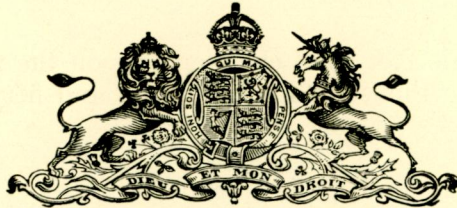
