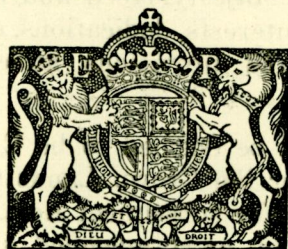

Act No. , 1952.

An Act to withdraw from Parramatta Park an area of about three acres; to deem the area so withdrawn to be dedicated under the Crown Lands Consolidation Act, 1913, as amended by subsequent Acts, for a war memorial and to be a public reserve within the meaning of section two of the Trustees of Public Reserves Enabling Act, 1924; to make provision with respect to the purposes for which the area so withdrawn may be used; and for purposes connected therewith.

Parramatta Park (War Memorial).

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of
 5 the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Parramatta Park short title.
 (War Memorial) Act, 1952".

2. (1) The land described in the Schedule to this Act Divesting and rededication of certain land for a war memorial.
 is hereby vested in Her Majesty freed and discharged
 10 from any trusts, estates, interests, dedications, conditions, restrictions, covenants and provisions affecting such land.

(2) Such land shall be deemed to be Crown land and to be dedicated under the Crown Lands Consolidation Act, 1913, as amended by subsequent Acts, for a war
 15 memorial, and the said Act, as so amended, shall apply to and in respect of such land.

(3) Such land shall be deemed to be a public reserve within the meaning of section two of the Trustees of
 20 Public Reserves Enabling Act, 1924.

3. (1) Subject to this Act, the trustees appointed in Use of land.
 respect of the land described in the Schedule to this Act may use it for such purposes as the Minister may approve.

(2) Without limiting the purposes which the
 25 Minister may approve and for which such land may be used pursuant to subsection one of this section, it shall be lawful for the Minister to approve of such land being used for the purpose of erecting or constructing thereon
 30 a memorial hall, bowling greens and tennis courts and for such land to be used for that purpose.

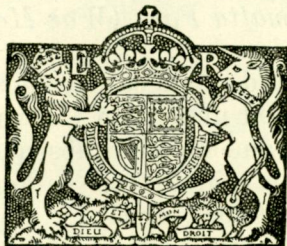

SCHEIDT

The plant is a small, upright, branched herb, growing to a height of 1-2 feet. The leaves are opposite, ovate, and have a serrated margin. The flowers are small, tubular, and are borne in a terminal raceme. The fruit is a small, globose capsule. The plant is native to the mountains of the Pyrenees and is cultivated in France for its medicinal properties. It is used as a diuretic and is also believed to have antiseptic and astringent properties.

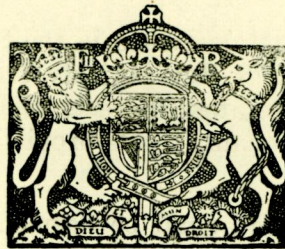

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title. **1.** This Act may be cited as the "Parramatta Park (War Memorial) Act, 1952".

Divesting and rededication of certain land for a war memorial. **2.** (1) The land described in the Schedule to this Act is hereby vested in Her Majesty freed and discharged from any trusts, estates, interests, dedications, conditions, restrictions, covenants and provisions affecting such land.

(2) Such land shall be deemed to be Crown land and to be dedicated under the Crown Lands Consolidation Act, 1913, as amended by subsequent Acts, for a war memorial, and the said Act, as so amended, shall apply to and in respect of such land.

(3) Such land shall be deemed to be a public reserve within the meaning of section two of the Trustees of Public Reserves Enabling Act, 1924.
