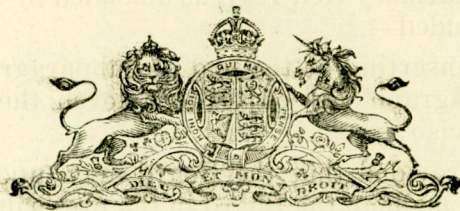

Act No. 8, 1952.

An Act to amend the Pharmacy Act, 1897, and certain other Acts in certain respects; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 17th April, 1952.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Pharmacy (Amendment) Act, 1952."

Short title, citation and commencement.

(2) The Pharmacy Act, 1897, as amended by subsequent Acts and by this Act, may be cited as the Pharmacy Act, 1897-1952.

Pharmacy (Amendment).

(3) (a) This section and section two of this Act shall commence upon the day upon which Her Majesty's assent to this Act is signified.

(b) Section three of this Act shall commence upon a day to be appointed by the Governor and notified by proclamation published in the Gazette.

2. The Pharmacy Act, 1897, as amended by subsequent Acts, is amended—

(a) by inserting at the end of subparagraph (i) of paragraph (g) of section eleven the following proviso:—

Provided that the Board may, upon application made to the Board in the prescribed manner and form and supported by such evidence as the Board requires, accept in lieu of any part of the requirements specified in the foregoing provisions of this subparagraph a course of training in the Australian Capital Territory which in the opinion of the Board is of a standard substantially similar to the standard fixed by or under this Act for that part of those requirements;

(b) by omitting from subparagraph (iii) of the same paragraph the words "under this Act" and by inserting in lieu thereof the words "by the Senate of the University of Sydney."

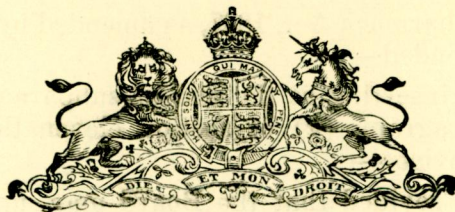

PHARMACY (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1952.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE objects of this Bill are—

- (a) to authorise the Senate of the University of Sydney to appoint examiners to conduct the examination in practical pharmacy prescribed by section 11 (g) (iii) of the Pharmacy Act, 1897;
- (b) to authorise the Pharmacy Board to accept in lieu of any part of the requirements of section 11 (g) (i) of that Act a course of training in pharmacy in the Australian Capital Territory;
- (c) to prohibit persons from entering into articles of apprenticeship in pharmacy after a future proclaimed date; and
- (d) to provide that from that date a person who has, after a three year course at the University of Sydney, obtained a degree or diploma in pharmacy and served for at least one year as an assistant to a registered pharmacist in this State or the Australian Capital Territory may be registered as a pharmacist under the Pharmacy Act, 1897.
