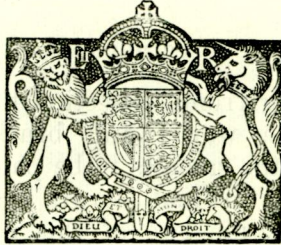

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Fines and Penalties (Amendment) Act, 1954." Short title and commencement.

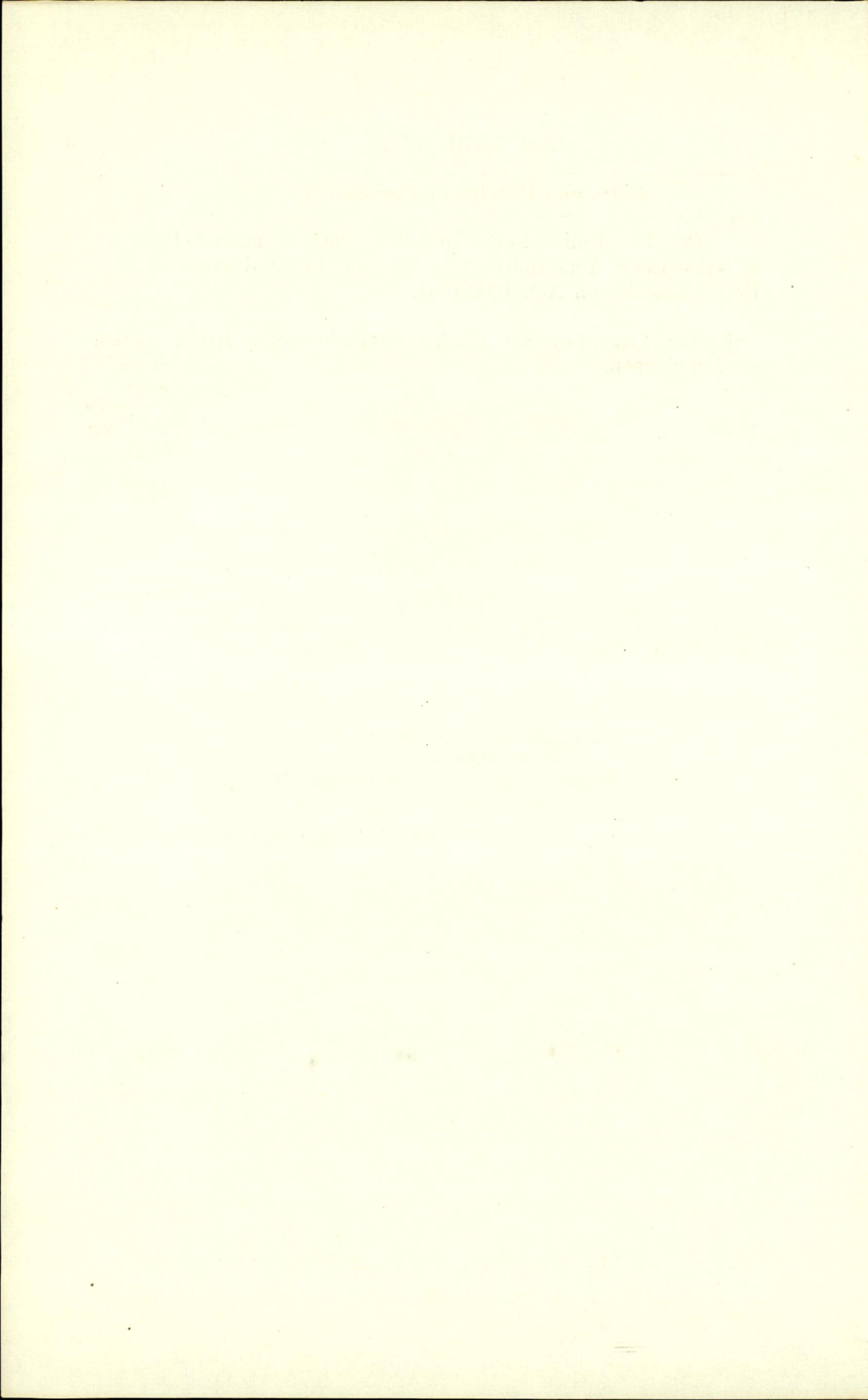

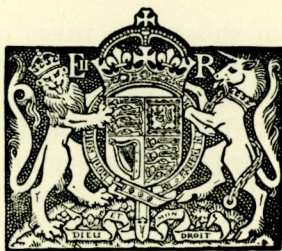

FINES AND PENALTIES (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1954.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE object of this Bill is to provide—

- (a) for the discontinuance of the apportionment of certain fines, penalties and forfeitures between the Consolidated Revenue Fund and the Police Superannuation and Reward Fund;
- (b) for the payment of such fines, penalties and forfeitures to the Consolidated Revenue Fund; and
- (c) consequential and ancillary provisions to the foregoing.

The Bill is to be retrospective to 1st July, 1954.
