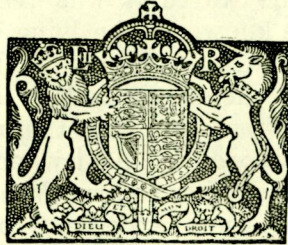

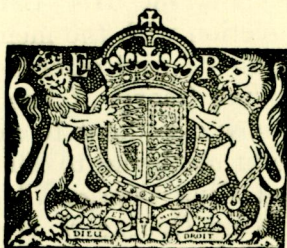

Annual Report of the Board of Directors

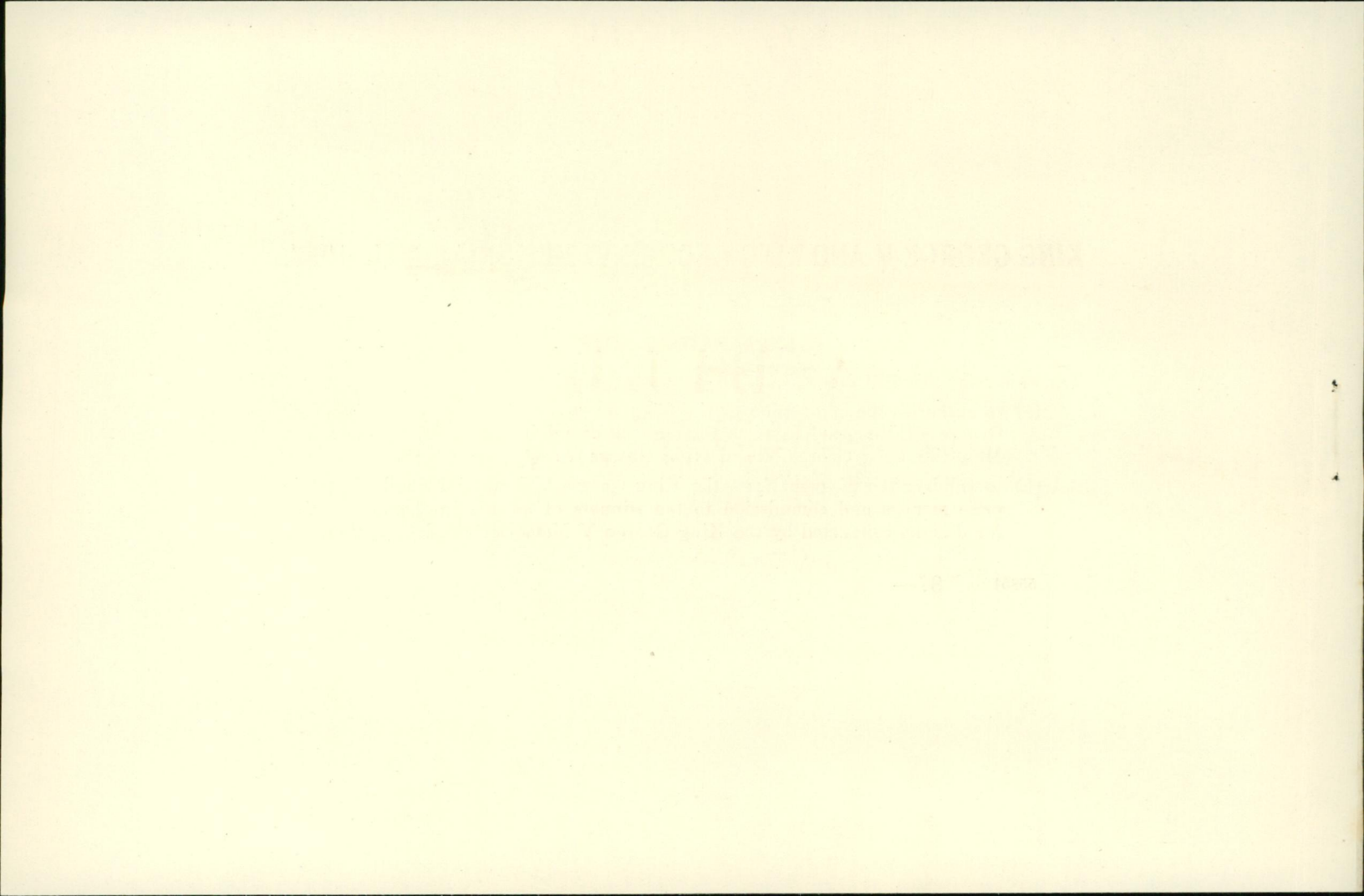

EXPLANATORY NOTE.
