BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE objects of this Bill are—

- (a) to define service for the purpose of entitling members of the Legislative Assembly to a pension on the basis of fifteen years service;
- (b) to increase the rates of contributions by contributors to the Legislative Assembly Members Provident Fund and to increase pensions to certain persons becoming entitled thereto after the commencement of the amendments made by this Bill.
