### EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE object of this Bill is—

- (a) to provide that a Commissioner for Main Roads, an Assistant Commissioner for Main Roads or officer appointed under the Main Roads Act, 1924-1951, retiring after attaining the age of sixty years, shall be paid pension from the date any extended leave acquired by such Commissioner, Assistant Commissioner or officer, if taken, would have commenced; and
- (b) to make other provisions incidental thereto.
