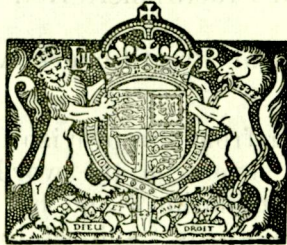

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

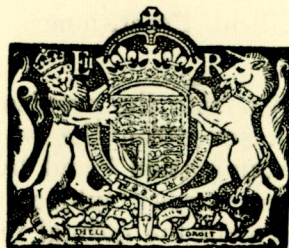

MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1953.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE objects of this Bill are—

- (a) to remove certain difficulties which have arisen in relation to the registration of medical practitioners from other parts of the British Empire with which this State had reciprocal arrangements;
- (b) to provide for the payment by registered medical practitioners of an annual roll fee, and
- (c) to make provisions incidental to the foregoing.
