MINES RESCUE (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1955.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE objects of this Bill are—

- (a) to alter the provisions of the Mines Rescue Act, 1925, that presently require a member of a permanent rescue corps established at a central rescue station to be at all times within immediate call of the station;
- (b) to require at least two trained persons to be within immediate call of the station at all times.
