THE LAW OF THE STATE OF TEXAS

Minimum Wage Act, 1954

Section 1. Short title and commencement.

(1) This Act may be called the Minimum Wage Act, 1954.

(2) It shall come into force on such date as the Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, specify in this behalf.

(3) The Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, specify the territories to which this Act shall apply.
