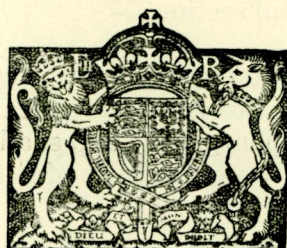

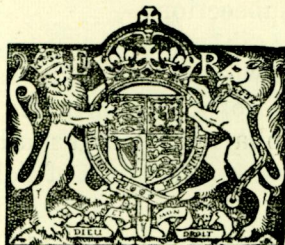

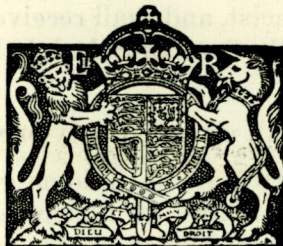

PHARMACY (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1954.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE object of this Bill is to authorise the Pharmacy Board of New South Wales to register as pharmacists persons who—

- (a) hold certificates or diplomas in pharmacy granted by colleges or boards outside New South Wales, which certificates or diplomas are recognised by that Board on the basis only that the holders thereof also satisfy the requirements of paragraphs (b), (c) and (d) below;
- (b) satisfy the University of Sydney by examination or otherwise of proficiency in chemistry, practical chemistry, botany and materia medica;

- (d) have served one year as an assistant in a pharmacy.
