**POLICE REGULATION (SUPERANNUATION)

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE object of this Bill is to increase pensions payable to members of the Police Force who, at 1st May, 1955, have retired from the Force or have been retired on account of injury received in the execution of their duty.

The increases are to be of the amount prescribed in the Bill and are to be effective as from 1st May, 1955.


