Act No. 43, 1953.

An Act to authorise the erection of extensions to St. Anne's Church of England, at Ryde, and the construction of footpaths and driveways to such Church, upon land comprised within the cemetery attached thereto; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 22nd December, 1953.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "St. Anne's Church Short title.

(1) It shall be lawful for the Church of England Property Trust Diocese of Sydney (hereinafter referred to as the "Trust") or such persons as may be authorised by the Trust to erect extensions (including vestries) to St. Anne's Church of England at Ryde and construct footpaths and driveways to such Church upon the land described in the Schedule to this Act, notwithstanding that such land comprises part of the cemetery attached to such Church.

(2) Before any extensions are erected or footpaths or driveways constructed pursuant to subsection one of this section, the Trust or the persons authorised as aforesaid shall, subject as hereinafter provided, cause any headstones, grave enclosures, and other surface structures on the said land to be collected with due care and removed and re-erected as far as practicable upon some other part of the said cemetery.

(3) At least three months before any headstones, grave enclosures, or other surface structures are collected, removed and re-erected under subsection two of this section, an advertisement of the intention to do so shall be inserted four times at intervals of not less than two weeks in newspapers circulating in the locality.

(4) At any time after the appearance of the first advertisement referred to in subsection three of this section and before the expiration of three months from the appearance of the last of such advertisements the representatives of any person buried in the said land may, at their own expense, remove the headstone, grave enclosure, or other surface structure erected over the grave of such person, and may, at their own expense, and with the permission of the Director-General of Public Health, remove to such cemetery as they desire, the remains of such person:

Provided that any such representatives shall give to the Trust not less than fourteen days' notice of their intention to effect any such removal.

 30 enclosure, or other surface structure erected over the grave of such person, and may, at their own expense, and with the permission of the Director-General of Public Health, remove to such cemetery as they desire, the remains of such person:

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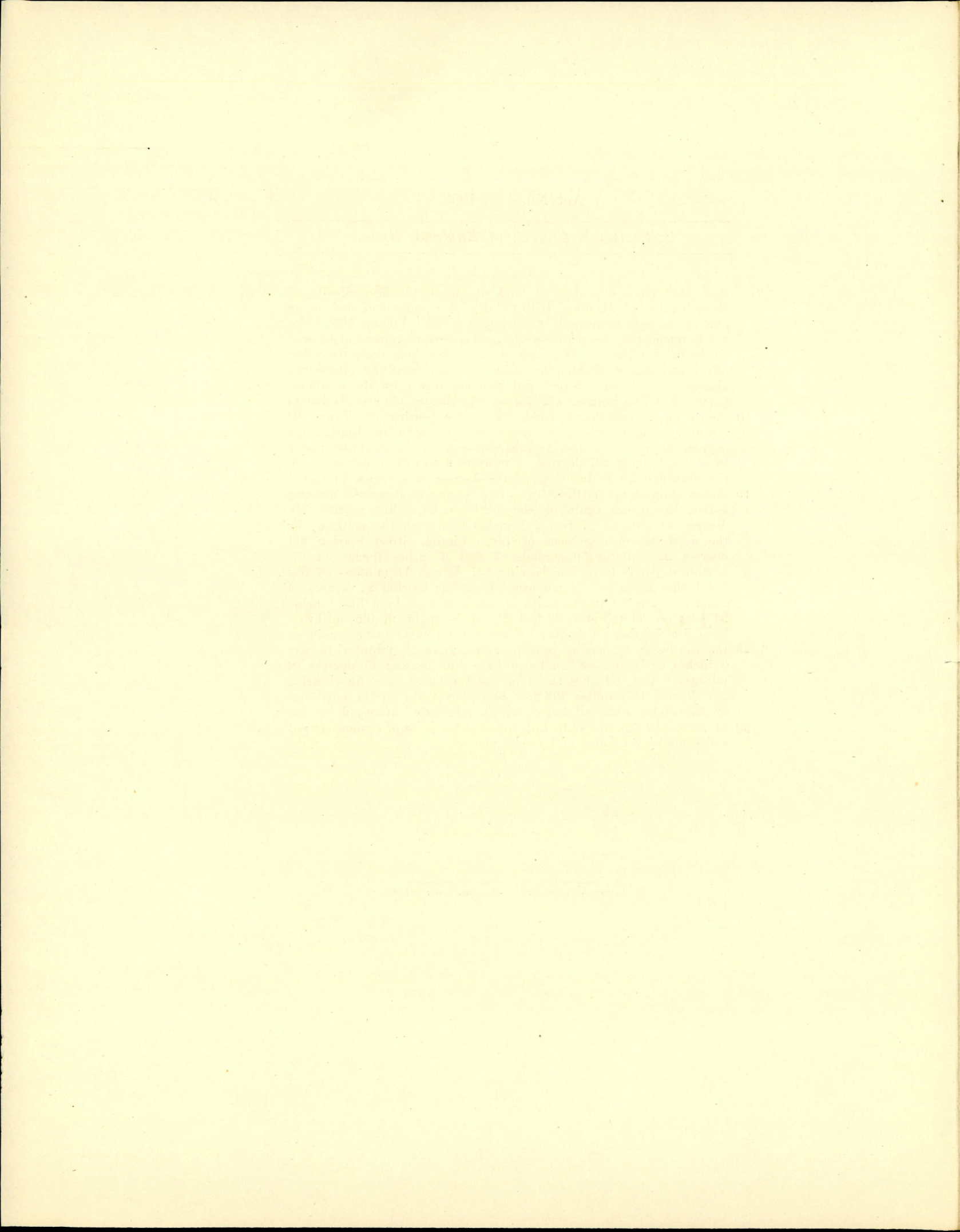
