THE object of this Bill is to sanction and to provide for the carrying out of work for the improvement of Bermagui Harbour as an authorised work under the provisions of the Public Works Act, 1912.

The object of this Bill is to enable and to provide for the carrying out of work for the improvement of Berrigalong Harbour as mentioned in the provisions of the Berrigalong Harbour Works Act, 1917.

A BILL

To sanction and to provide for the carrying out of works for the Bermagui Harbour; and for purposes connected therewith.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Bermagui Harbour Works Short title. Act, 1958".

Bermagui Harbour Works.

2. (1) (a) The carrying out of the work described in the Schedule to this Act is hereby sanctioned. ^{Work sanctioned.}

(b) The said work shall be deemed to be an authorised work within the meaning of the Public Works Act, 1912, as amended by subsequent Acts.

(c) The Minister for Public Works is empowered to carry out the said work and shall be the constructing authority for the same within the meaning of the said Act, as so amended, and shall enter into such contracts and take all such necessary steps for the proper execution thereof as such authority may think proper.

(d) The provisions of the Public Works Act, 1912, as amended by subsequent Acts, sections thirty-four, thirty-five, thirty-six and thirty-seven excepted, shall apply to and in respect of the said work.

(2) Without prejudice to the generality of subsection one of this section the provisions of section thirty-eight of the Public Works Act, 1912, as amended by subsequent Acts, shall apply to and in respect of any contracts referred to in paragraph (c) of subsection one of this section.

3. The plan of the said work is the plan marked "Bermagui Harbour Works" signed by the Minister for Public Works and countersigned by the Director of Public Works and deposited in the public office of the said Minister. ^{The plan.}

25 4. The cost of carrying out the said work (exclusive of land resumptions) is estimated at two hundred and thirty thousand pounds and such estimated cost shall not, under any circumstances, be exceeded by more than ten per centum. ^{Estimated cost.}

SCHEDULE.

Bermagui Harbour Works.

SCHEDULE.

Works for the Bermagui Harbour comprising:—

- 5 (1) The construction of a breakwater on the western side of the Bermagui River entrance and extending in a northerly direction a distance of seven hundred and eighty feet from the existing foreshore.
- 10 (2) The construction of two groynes on the eastern side of the river entrance one extending one hundred and thirty feet in a southerly direction and the other two hundred and eighty feet in a north-westerly direction from the existing foreshore.
- 15 (3) The construction of two training walls one on either side of the river channel near the entrance, that on the northern side of the channel having a length of five hundred and sixty feet and that on the southern side a length of six hundred and sixty feet.
- 20 (4) The dredging of an area in the anchorage basin to a depth of eight feet below Indian Spring Low Water, disposal of dredged material on Crown lands to the east and west of the basin and the construction of reclamation walls for the retention of this material.
- (5) Other incidental works as deemed necessary or desirable by the Constructing Authority.

The whole of the works hereinbefore described to be subject to such modifications as may be deemed necessary or desirable by the

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General Instructions

Section 1
